

SGA's European Flight To Definitely Take Place

The SGA flight is off the ground! The plane has been definitely secured and the roundtrip tickets will most likely cost \$285, as planned.

The 80-passenger plane is about two-thirds full but the required amount for a down payment has been taken in. Reservations and deposits are still being taken.

A \$100 deposit is required with the balance payable by April 15.

It had been feared that enough people would not sign up for the flight and that the cost would have to be raised slightly. However, SGA President Leonard Julius explained that the \$300 added to the cost of reserving the plane which was to be used for administrative expenses had been reinvested into the plane's initial cost. This would make a price hike unnecessary, he said.

Reservations for the flight may be made by anyone who has been officially associated with the University for at least six months and his wife (or husband), children and parents.

The flight will leave New York for London June 13 and return from Paris July 23.

SGA is sponsoring only the flight, although it will accept applications for tours which the Penn State Travel Agency is offering. SGA is working through the agency in its sponsorship.

Those traveling on the flight must agree to go to Europe and return as a group. There will be no one-way tickets sold.

Information on the flight and tours may be obtained at the SGA office, 203A Hetzel Union. SGA also has information on summer jobs available in Europe.
