Nittany Council, Diem to Meet

Albert E. Diem, vice president for business administration, yesterday agreed to meet with the Nittany Area Council Monday to discuss the complaints of the residents on the living and dining accommodations.

Otto E. Mueller, director of Housing, and Robert C. Proffitt, director of food service, will also attend the meeting, according to Barry Rein, president of the council.

A questionnaire is now being circulated among the Nittany residents to determine their chief complaints.

In a meeting Monday night, the council agreed to submit a formal protest to the Department of Housing on the issue of paying a \$30 fee when one occupant of a double room leaves the residence area. It was felt that the size difference between an single and a double does not warrant the added fee.

The council will also discuss the

future of the Nittany Dining Hall, which will not be used next semester. It was felt that if the building was not going to be torn down, study facilities could be incorporated into its structure.

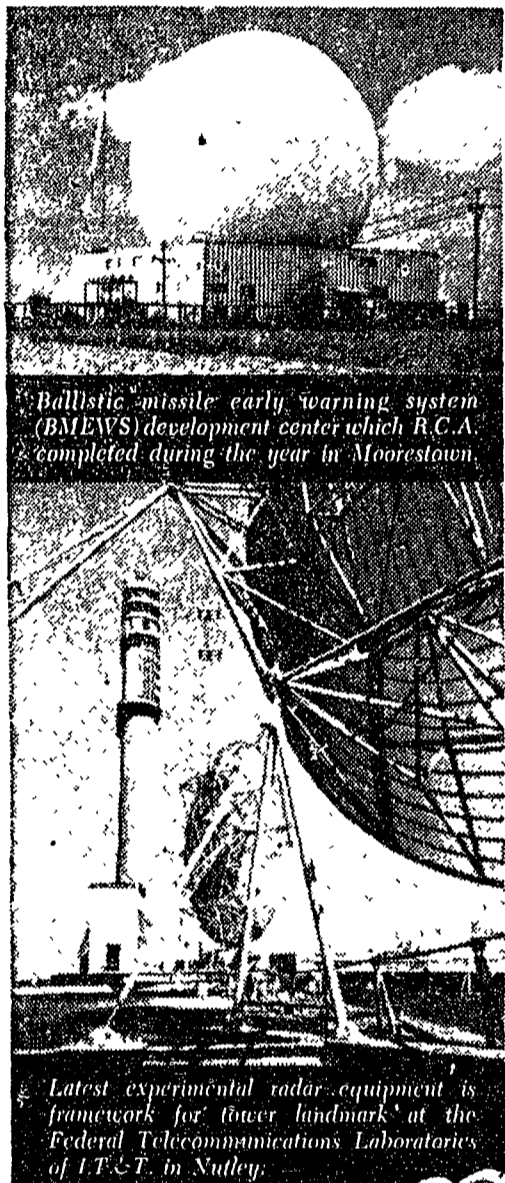

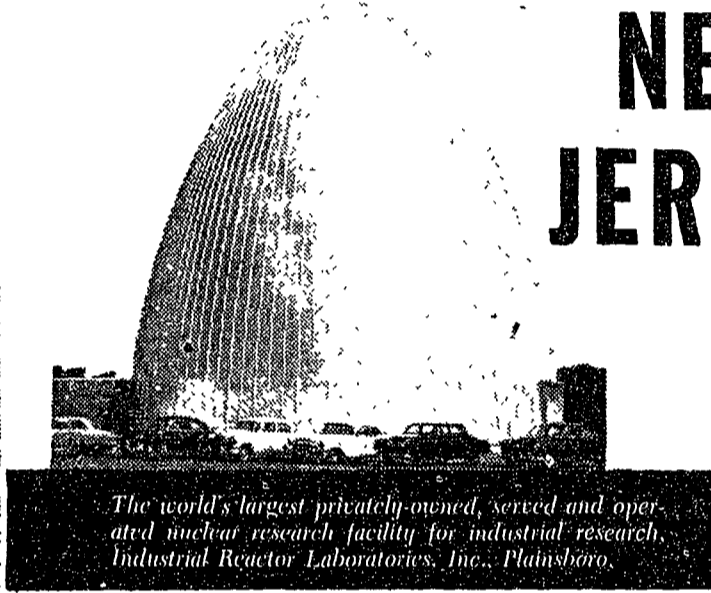

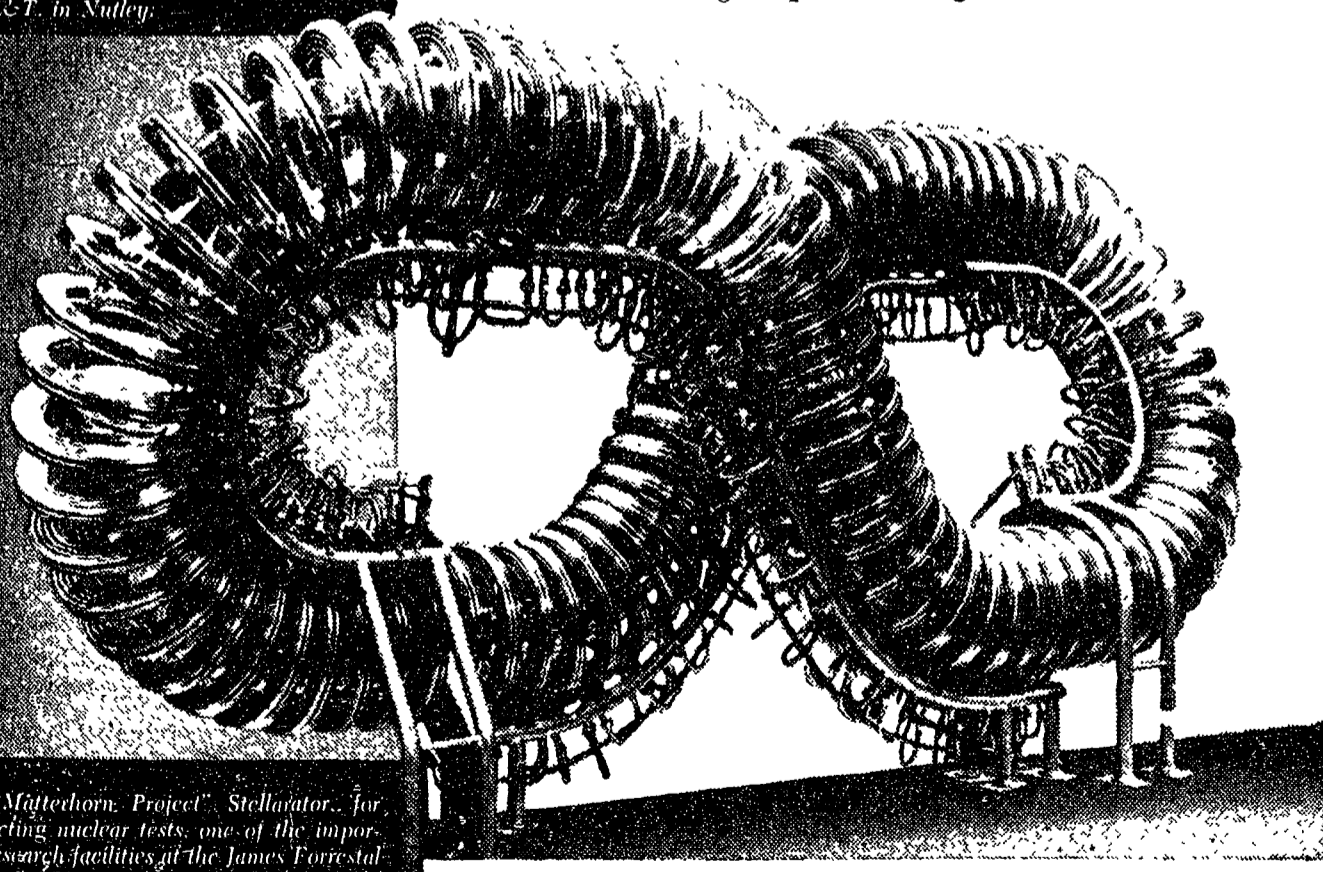
