

Spring Grid Drills Postponed One Week

There's a big red panic button on one of the cabinets in Rip Engle's office and after the Lion coach took a look at the weather yesterday he pushed it and postponed spring football practice until March 26.

His Liberty Bowl champs originally were scheduled to start drills Saturday, but poor practice conditions forced the postponement.

Even though practice will begin a week later, the Blue-White game will be played April 30 as planned.

Once things get underway, Engle's main problems will be at quarterback and tackle where graduation will claim his top men.

Quarterback is the biggest headache because Engle must find a suitable replacement for All-American Richie Lucas.

On the basis of his Liberty Bowl showing, Galen Hall appears to be the man for the job, but Engle also plans to give converted halfback Dick Hoak a thorough trial.

Hoak was an all-state quarterback at Jeannette High School and he played that position during his freshman year.

The Lions lose their three top tackles — All-American Charley Janerette, Andy Stynchula and Tom Mulraney.

Engle has veterans Stew Barber and Jim Smith back but after that the ranks are pretty thin. Additional help will have to come from the freshman team and sophomores Charlie Sieminski and Jerry Farkas.
