

Questionnaire Shows SGA Debate-- Nittany Complaints

Oh not to live in Nittany, now that spring is here!

This might be termed the theme song of many of the residents of Nittany Halls who recently responded to a questionnaire asking for criticisms of dining and housing conditions in the area.

The questionnaire contained two general questions: "Please list your major complaints on food service and dining hall conditions," and "list your major complaints in respect to housing."

Over 550 respondents complained of a leaking dining hall roof. "The leaking occurs not only in the dining area, but also in the food preparation area" Barry Rein, president of Nittany Council, said.

Second on the list of over 69 complaints registered was the low temperature in the dining hall for the breakfast hour; 320 students complained of this condition.

A total of 240 complaints were received on "unsanitary conditions" in the hall. Details of this complaint included items as

"sweeping floors when people are still eating," "unclean dishes and glasses," and "unsanitary preparation of food."

Among the major comments on the housing situation was: "If a double room is vacated by one occupant, the other should be allowed to remain without paying an extra fee."

The muddy condition of the area in the spring was cited by 110 students. "The area is poorly paved and a major annoyance to the residents," Rein said.

Also noted by 270 students was "inadequate temperature control and ventilation in the rooms"

Darran then said that if the investigation found that persons acted "detrimentally," disciplinary action should be taken.

MacRae said he was not interested in disciplinary action—only in bringing the findings of the investigation to light.



