

Offices, Labs Now Occupy Eng Building

Sections of the Chemical Engineering Building, which is nearing its final stages of completion, are being occupied as offices and laboratories.

The office of the Department of Chemical Engineering, headed by Dr. Merrell R. Fenske, has already moved from Walker Laboratory to the new building. One laboratory section has also occupied the building, which was built by the General State Authority.

During the next week or two, other laboratories and materials stored in many locations on campus and off-campus will also be moved.

The installation of tall distillation, extraction and other separational units is expected to be completed within a year. The building will provide facilities for the petroleum refining laboratory, a unit of the Department of Chemical Engineering.

The laboratory had previously occupied a frame structure, which was near the University power plant and was torn down to make possible the construction of Hammond Engineering Building.

Walker Lab has been the headquarters of the petroleum refining laboratory for the past two years.

Shenk, Myers Win Top Essay Prizes

William Shenk, junior in meteorology from Washington, D.C., and Joel Myers, junior in meteorology from Philadelphia, were awarded first and second prizes, respectively, in the national essay contest sponsored by the American Meteorological Society.

Shenk won \$150 for his paper titled "Forecasting of Hurricane Motions" and Myers was given \$100 for his "Snowfall Variations in Philadelphia."

323 People Give Blood in Red Cross Drive

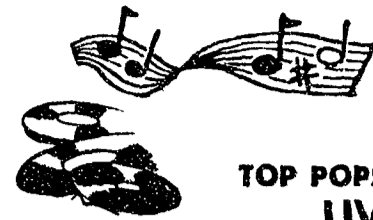

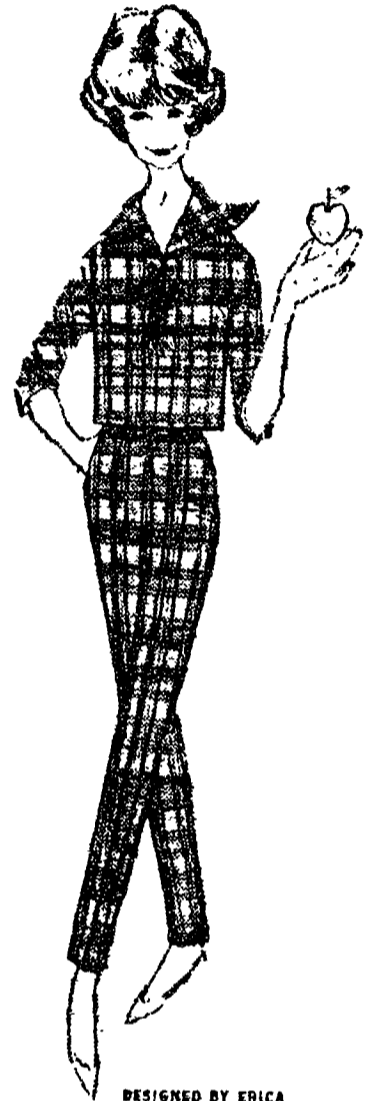

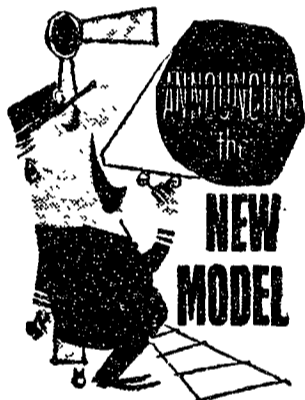
