

AKapPsi Votes To Join TIM Housing System

Alpha Kappa Psi, men's professional business fraternity, has voted to join the Town Independent Men's social housing system when the group buys a house.

The fraternity withdrew its previous petition asking the Senate Committee on Student Activities for social-professional status. The members said they felt that the new status might lead to losing much of its professional nature and becoming entirely a social fraternity.

TIM has agreed to grant the fraternity a charter if its house can meet the regulations and pass inspection, George Finnu, TIM social house chairman, said.

In order to receive a social charter from TIM all members in the house must sign a petition and get the approval of their landlord in order to have parties. The house must then be inspected by the TIM Board of Control and the dean of men's office.

The professional fraternity did not want to join the IFC system because they wish to continue taking fraternity and independent men as members. When they finally purchase a house they want to rent rooms to men who are not fraternity members.

Legion Head OK's Policy On Speakers

Regis F. Cusick, chairman of the Pennsylvania American Legion's counter subversive activities committee, told President Eric A. Walker yesterday that he was satisfied with the University's position on visiting speakers to the students, The Associated Press reported.

Cusick expressed this satisfaction following an assertion in a patriotic journal that some left-wing speakers had appeared at University gatherings.

This statement was made by Andrew Green, Harrisburg attorney, in a magazine he edits for the Pennsylvania Society of the Sons of the American Revolution.

Cusick said, "There appears to be a planned program on the part of some Communist fronts to place 'travelers' before students in colleges and universities throughout the commonwealth."


