Appointments Received By Belasco, Valdman

Dr. Simon Belasco, associate professor of Romance languages, and Dr. Albert Valdman, assistant professor of Romance languages, have received appointments as directors of the linguistics programs at Colgate University and the University of Oregon, respectively, this summer.

Authorized by the National Defense Act of 1958, each institute will enroll 60 teachers of French and Spanish, 30 in each language, for a 7-week period extending from June 23 to Aug. 13. Colgate is providing a program for high school teachers. Oregon will enroll both secondary and elementary school teachers of foreign languages.

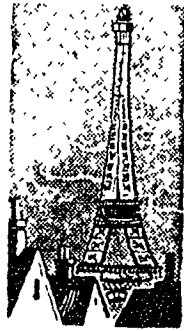
