

Yale Prof To Speak On Ecology

Dr. Paul B. Sears, conservationist at Yale University, will speak at 8 tonight in 121 Sparks on "Ecology of Man."

The lecture is sponsored by the Graduate School Lecture Series and Gamma Sigma Delta, the honorary society in agriculture.

Sears, who is professor of botany, graduated from Ohio Wesleyan University and received his master of arts degree from the University of Nebraska and his doctor of philosophy degree from the University of Chicago.

He began his teaching career at Ohio State University and taught at the University of Nebraska, the University of Oklahoma, Teachers College at Columbia and at Oberlin College before his appointment to the Yale faculty in 1950.

Sears has served as president of the Nebraska Academy of Science and in 1956 was president of the American Association for the Advancement of Science. He served as secretary-general of the Botanical Society of America from 1924 to 1928 and is a past president of the Zoological Society of America.

Since 1956 he has been chairman of the Ohio Wildlife Council of the National Audubon Society.

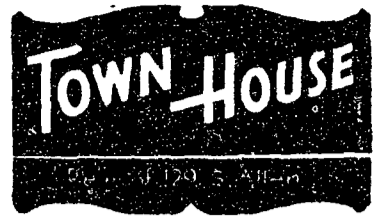

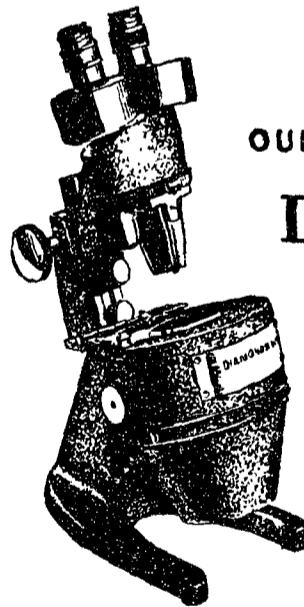
