

Two Grapplers Take Last Second Wins

Final second points were the margin of victory last night as Dick Burchill and Ken Dixon moved into the semi-finals of the IM wrestling tournament in Rec Hall.

Burchill, 128-pounder from Pi Kappa Alpha, reversed Jim Fleck of Phi Kappa Tau with 0:15 left to win a 4-2 decision. Dixon, an independent, broke loose for a point with 0:20 left, and with time advantage, won a referee's decision over Fred Ruebman.

In another close match, Bill Eberhardt of Alpha Zeta overcame a last minute escape point and beat Stan Pruss of Delta Theta Sig, 5-4, in their 167-pound match.

Footballers Sam Sobczak and Al Maiello put on quite a show for the IM fans before Sobczak finally won out, 5-2, in a heavy-weight bout.

Tom Fey, Phi Delta Theta, and Gene Greskovich, Alpha Chi Sig, came from behind in their matches to win decisions. Fey trailed Walt Kearney, 2-0, at the end

of the first period but bounced back to win 6-2. An escape and a takedown brought Greskovich from behind to decision. Jeff Lightner of Lambda Chi Alpha, 6-1.

George Saba of Sigma Chi scored the fastest pin in 0:30 over Pete Wanser of Phi Kappa Psi. He did it with a catch pin. Footballer Andy Stynchula, wrestling heavyweight for Sigma Phi Epsilon, followed with a 1:05 pin over Wayne Smith of Lambda Chi Alpha.

Golf Coach Says Opener Saturday Will Be Tough

"Our first meet will be our roughest," Penn State golf coach Joe Boyle said yesterday as he speculated on the coming season.

The Lions' first match will be a triangular affair with Maryland and Georgetown at College Park, Md., Saturday. The Terps were one of the three teams that defeated Penn State last year while Georgetown always fields a strong squad.

Five returning lettermen, Dick Burgoon, Roy Altman, Ed Kormos, John Morton, and Haydn Thomas, will form the nucleus of Boyle's team. Burgoon, State's captain, had a 4-5 record last year, but Boyle expects him to do much better this season with added experience.

"Two other lettermen, Morton and Thomas, have improved tremendously since last year," Boyle said, "and they should really help the team this year."

Boyle expects sophs Gary Grantham, Bill Smith, and Frank Cerar plus junior Angelo Ortenzi to round out the squad "As soon as the sticks are out we can see

how these boys are this year," Boyle said.

The 1960 campaign promises to be one of State's roughest in many years with such powers as Maryland, Penn, and Colgate dotting the schedule.

Maryland has six returning lettermen, including Deane Beman, the British Amateur champion Beman will probably face Burgoon Saturday.
