

Stadium Parking Lot Picnics Expected for Next Season

"Parking-lot picnics" are expected to become a common sight at next year's football games, with the establishment of 10,000 parking spaces in the vicinity of Beaver Stadium.

Ernest B. McCoy, director of athletics, said that the proposed parking plan at Beaver Stadium will provide a perfect setting for mid-day snacks.

"Eating out of the back of the car is ideally suited to parties coming to the campus from towns and cities within a 100-mile radius, and has been popular at Army, Rutgers, Michigan, Cornell and other Ivy League schools," McCoy said.

McCoy, in outlining the parking plan for the first time, explained that reserved parking will be made available in advance at \$1 per game or \$3 for the home schedule of four games. Purchasers of reserved parking will be furnished colored stickers which they will display in their wind-

shields for the benefit of attendant who will direct them to their parking area.

Non-reserved or general parking will be available at 50 cents per game, but this will not be purchased before the day of the game. Users of the general parking areas will pay the attendant as they leave their cars.

McCoy added that reserved parking will be located east of the projected University Drive.

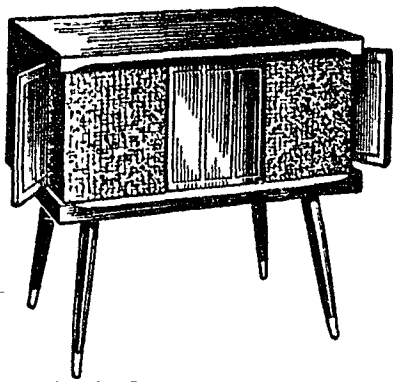

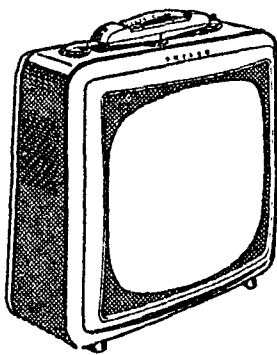

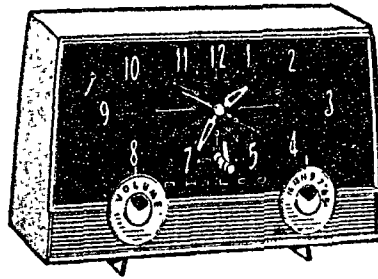
