

WSGA Will Discuss Reorganization Plans

The Women's Student Government Association will hold a weekend retreat after the spring recess to discuss the reorganization of WSGA as a rule making body.

They will also make plans for putting more emphasis on their function of helping women adjust to college and society.

Under reorganization, one of the main problems to be considered is the fate of the freshman council under the system of intergrating freshman with upper-class women in the residence halls. Margaret McPherson, WSGA Senate president, said.

The council is made up of the presidents and vice presidents of the freshman residence halls. They discuss freshman problems relating to their adjustment to University living.

Marjorie Ganter, chairman of freshman council, said that Dorothy J. Lipp, dean of women, seems to be in favor of freshman and upperclass women sharing the governing positions in residence halls. However, Miss Ganter said, Dean Lipp had not yet decided on the governing system of the halls under integrated women's living.

Miss Ganter feels that retaining the freshman council is necessary so that freshman leadership spirit will not be stifled and also freshman problems could be solved.

She said that freshman council was considering a plan requiring a certain percentage of residence hall leaders to be freshmen when the integrated system goes into effect.

Miss McPherson said that WSGA must also consider what their place as a rule making body will be when co-educational living goes into effect. Since the men's judicial body is Off-Campus Tribunal while the women's judicial body is WSGA Judicial Board a re-

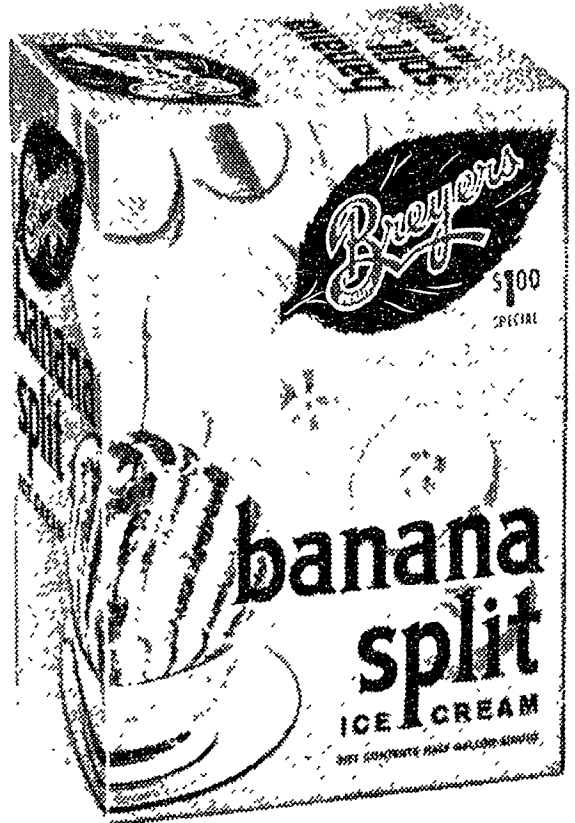
