

# Flags to Fly In Honor of Americas' Unity

The flags of 21 American republics will be raised in honor of the unity of the Americas at 11:50 a.m. today on the lawn of Old Main.

A student from each of the Pan-American countries will be assisted by a member of ROTC in the raising of his country's flag.

In celebration of the 70th anniversary of the Organization of American States, the University will observe Pan-American Day on Thursday.

This year will mark the 20th year that the school has observed the day.

The Pan-American tree which was planted last year with ground from the Latin American countries will be rededicated at 4:15 p.m. Thursday on the east terrace of the Hetzel Union Building. Two students from Costa Rica will add soil from their country to the tree this year.

At this ceremony, President Eisenhower's Pan-American Day Proclamation will be read. Music for the program will consist of songs in Spanish by the Latin American Educators Group and selections by the State College High School Band.

The last event of the week will be a program of songs and dances of the Americas to be held at 8 p.m. Friday in the social hall of Faith Evangelical and Reformed Church at College Ave and Locust Lane.

nus at not dealing well with you fellows."

Simes agreed with the council that the residents should have been given advance warning of the evacuation.

As to the damage from Sunday's incident, Otto Mueller, head of the Department of Housing, said yesterday that "it didn't amount to much." Mueller said, however, that the students who had been living in Nittany 27 would be charged with any damage which occurred in their rooms.

Bernreuter, however, said yesterday that he did not think it would be necessary to assess the students for the damage.

The council voted to consider the four or five residence halls with the least number of residents and then narrow them down to one by considering the academic aptitude and general spirit within the residence halls.

When asked what improvements were being made, Rein said that bookcases, painting, doors on shower stalls and matching dressers in each room would be installed in the lobbies, cardplaying booths, an extra phone, picture frames will be added, he said.

Michael Dzvonik, Nittany 39, asked what was being done to give more space in the individual rooms. Bernreuter answered, "Nothing can be done."
