

# Turkish Students Hold Demonstrations

ISTANBUL, Turkey (P) — Thousands of tough Turkish troops patrolled Istanbul last night to curb Korea-like demonstrations against the strongman government of Premier Adnan Menderes.

Inflamed by the example of youth in Korea, about 10,000 students and others touched off a noisy protest against the Menderes regime earlier yesterday. It grew into a riot.

About 50 persons were injured and 4, by some accounts, died. Martial law was invoked in Istanbul and in Ankara, although no disturbances were reported in the

capital. The military commander of Istanbul, Lt. Gen. Fahri Ozdilek, denied the unofficial reports that four persons had been killed.

"I have no reports of any deaths," he said, "but I know there were some injuries."

He also said martial law and a 9 p.m.-to-5 a.m. curfew would be enforced as long as he thought necessary.

The presence of so many troops, some of them battle-hardened veterans of the Korean War, restored an atmosphere of calm by nightfall.

Shouting slogans of praise for Korean students whose pressure ended Syngman Rhee's regime this week, demonstrators denounced Menderes as a dictator.

# Von Braun Envisions Space Life

NEW YORK (P) — Dr. Werner von Braun, the space scientist, said yesterday it is "likely" that life exists in the universe outside the earth.

He envisioned an eventual meeting of an earth astronaut with "another being in space."

Von Braun used the word "likely" with deliberate purpose, he told a dinner of the Bureau of Advertising of the American Newspaper Publishers Association in a prepared address.

"There is good reason to assume, on purely scientific grounds and on evidence adduced by observation, that life of some kind exists elsewhere in the universe," he said. "In my opinion that is an entirely logical assumption," he added.

# Beeghly to Head J&L

PITTSBURGH (P) — Charles M. Beeghly yesterday was named president of Jones & Laughlin Steel Corp., the nation's fourth largest steel producer.

He formerly was president of J. & L.'s strip division in Youngstown, Ohio.

# Hoffa Attorneys Use New Law

WASHINGTON (P) — James R. Hoffa's attorneys yesterday employed the new labor law, repeatedly criticized by Hoffa, as an argument to try to stop a court attempt to oust Hoffa as Teamsters Union president.

David Previant, Teamsters Union attorney, told U.S. District Judge Joseph R. Jackson that only a union's members can elect or remove its officers. Previant said this is bolstered by provisions of the Labor Control Act enacted last year.

Dr. Chadwick Hansen, instructor in English literature, has been granted a Fulbright International Exchange Program award to lecture on American literature and American civilization.

# Venezuelan Crash Caused by Bomb

CARACAS, Venezuela (P) — The government intelligence service said last night the crash of a Venezuelan airliner earlier in the day in the central plains was caused by a bomb blast.

Eleven persons were killed. There were two survivors.

The intelligence service said it was trying to learn if a bomb had been placed aboard by a mentally deranged person or if it was part of a sabotage plot.

The announcement said the plane was blown apart by an explosion an hour after it took off.
