The Scheduling Office has released the conflict examination schedule for the spring semester, 1960.

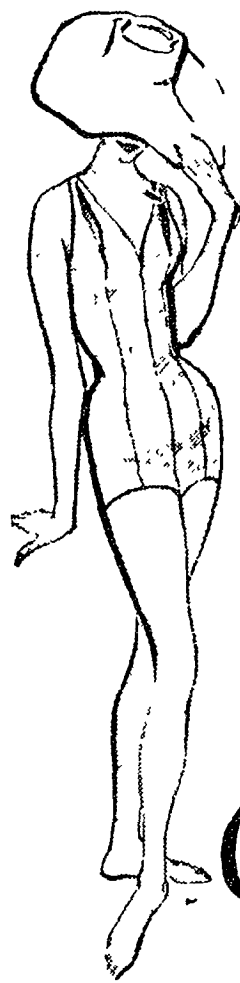

Mortar Board To Honor Five

Five Mortar Board scholars will be named this spring by the University chapter of Mortar Board.

The scholars, who will be selected from junior women, will be chosen primarily for academic excellence. A financial grant will accompany the award of a Mortar Board scholar chair if the student needs financial assistance. The amount of the award will not be disclosed.

Financial awards will have a maximum value of \$125 this year. Funds for the awards are provided by the Helen Eakin Eisenhower and the Charlotte E. Ray scholarship funds of the Mortar Board chapter.

The winners of these awards will be announced in May. The presentation of the awards will be given at the University awards service when the Evan Pugh scholars are named and other awards are presented.

State Grants \$4650 For Trade Exams

The Department of Public Instruction of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania has awarded the University a grant of \$4650 to be used under the direction of Dr. Carl J. Schaefer, associate professor of industrial education, to develop trade competency examinations in technical occupations.

The need for skilled technicians in industry is recognized under the National Defense Education Act, which provides for training such people and places the responsibility for state programs with the public school systems.

Schaefer's job is to develop 12 examinations in competency to give to persons interested in teaching technical occupations. He is working with two groups of people in developing the examinations "content experts" in the field, who can enumerate the occupational skills and related technical knowledge, and personnel at three teacher education institutions.

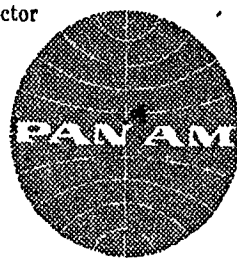
