

Players to Present Fairy Tale

Extravagant is the word for the Penn State Players' production of Terrence Rattigan's "Sleeping Prince."

Not only are the characters extravagant in their actions, but also the set for the play has been designed in this vein.

Tickets will go on sale 1 p.m. Monday at the Hetzel Union desk.

The 2-act play takes place during a royal coronation in England in 1911, and the action is set in the drawing room of the Carpathian Legation.

Russell G. Whaley, associate professor of theater arts who has designed the set, said that it has been designed in order to give the impression that a mad European decorator "just let go and went wild on it."

The color scheme for the regent interior is being done in all

types of purple ranging from light lavender to a deep bluish purple. Golds, gilt and white are also being used on the set.

Whaley said that it has been very hard to find light roccoco furniture in State College, so the decoration is being done in a Georgian style.

He said that the room is not decorated in the normal conservative English style, but the style is romantic and sort of make-believe to go along with the make-believe idea of the whole play.

All of the music for the comedy has been recorded by Arthur Schubert, freshman in engineering from Andalucia.

Schubert said that he is using Shostakovich's "Festival Overture" as background music because it gives a royal impression with its trumpet fanfares.

Schubert has recorded some hand organ music for the small

song and dance number which will be done by Carole Rits who is playing the lead role of the American showgirl.

Gypsy violin music has been recorded for the scene where the Prince Regent, played by Joel Daniels, orders this type of music in order to present a seductive mood for his courting.

"Sleeping Prince," which is directed by Robert D. Reifsnider, associate professor of theater arts, will be presented next Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights in Schwab.
