

Senior Day Tickets Now Available

Tickets for Senior Class Day, which will be held from 2 to 4 Saturday afternoon in Schwab, are now available at the Hetzel Union desk, according to Martin Leshner, chairman.

Tickets will be given out on a first come, first served basis, with a limit of three tickets to a person.

"Although this is Senior Class Day, it will not be closed to others. It should also be stressed that students needing more than three tickets for a family may have them," Leshner said.

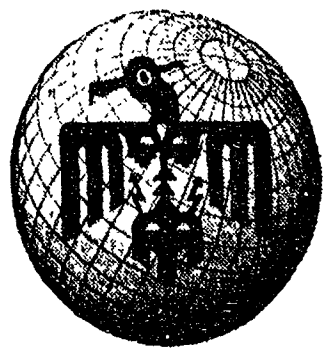

Present senior women who wish to do graduate work at the University are being offered the opportunity of a work-study program as residence hall counselors. Mrs. Hugh Davison, staff assistant to the dean of women, is in charge of interviewing for these positions.

Resident counselors will have supervisory, counseling and program responsibilities in each of the residence halls after 5 p.m. under next fall's new set-up.
