"The important thing is to find the lever to start disarmament," said Bourov as he outlined the Soviet Union's proposal which would reduce armies and destroy weapons in three stages over a 4-year period.

Norman Whitney, national secretary for Peace Education for the American Friends Service Committee, whose talk on the same subject followed Bourov's, said that Americans do not fully realize the implications of the present nuclear situation.

"It is the judgement of Sir Philip Noel-Baker, one of the two most informed men on disarmament, that the chances are 50-50 that mankind will destroy itself," said Whitney. He further quoted Baker as saying that the world has at the most ten years to resolve this problem.

Therefore the U.S. must commit itself to total disarmament which would involve great risks, but would infinitely lessen the risks which we now face in the nuclear race," he said.

"The United States has come nowhere near matching the proposals of disarmament given by Khrushchev and by Selwyn Lloyd," Whitney said.

"The basic pre-requisite of disarmament and peaceful co-existence is the principle of ideological co-existence," said Aspaturian. Khrushchev calls such a principle impossible mainly because it implies there might be some other ideology of equal validity than that in the Soviet Union, he said.

DARE will contact Dorothy J. Lipp, dean of women, Frank J. Simes, dean of men, and Harold K. Schilling, dean of the Graduate School, to get information for the investigation.

Schilling will be contacted to get information on the situation in the housing of foreign students, most of whom are graduate students.

A program, planned by DARE, to honor the anniversary of the Supreme Court ruling of

May 17, 1954, making segregated schooling unconstitutional will highlight Henry F. Foster, professor of constitutional law at the University of Pittsburgh. Planned for May 17, Foster's speech will cover "The Constitutional and Segregation Cases: How law has responded to social conditions."

Foster is a member of the Bar of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania and has taught law at the Universities of Oklahoma and Nebraska. He has argued two briefs on segregated schools, and was a fellow in law and behavioral science at the University of Chicago last year.

A fund drive for the benefit of students involved in non-violent, anti-segregation demonstrations in the South will begin on Sunday and last through Tuesday.
