

Artists Series Program To Feature Noted Pianist

Anton Kuerti, the 26-year old pianist who won the Leventritt Award three years ago, will appear with the University Symphony Orchestra at 8:30 p.m. next Tuesday in Schwab Auditorium.

Kuerti will appear as the last presentation for this semester of the University Artist Series.

Ticket distribution for the concert will begin 1 p.m. today at the Hetzel Union desk. Non-student tickets will go on sale tomorrow.

Since winning the Leventritt Award in 1957 (only two other pianists have been so honored since 1950—the others being John Browning and Van Cliburn), Kuerti has run up an impressive string of triumphs.

He has appeared with the symphonies of six major cities and performed under such conductors as Hilsberg, Krips, Ormandy, Paray, Schippers and Szell.

Kuerti's first major public appearance was with the Boston Pops Orchestra under Arthur Fiedler at the age of 11. Viennaborn, he came to the United States at the age of four and studied on scholarships at the Longy School, Peabody Conservatory, the Cleveland Institute of Music and the Curtis Institute.

Prior to winning the Leventritt Award, Kuerti was also winner of a Fulbright Award

and the Philadelphia Orchestra Youth Prize. In addition to his United States appearances, he has performed extensively in Canada, in South America and at the Festival of Two Worlds in Spoleto, Italy.

Kuerti, described variously as "one of the very finest young pianists now concertizing," and a "major musical talent," will play Beethoven's Fourth Piano Concerto with the University Symphony, under the direction of Theodore Karhan, associate professor of music.

The program will also include two solo numbers by Kuerti and two numbers by the orchestra.

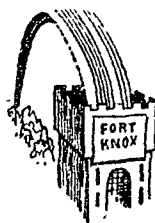
