

# Stickmen to Face Hobart, Grimm Resigns Cub Post Syracuse This Weekend

Breaking a three game losing streak against the calibre of teams such as Syracuse and Hobart is no easy task but that's the job facing the Penn State lacrosse team this weekend.

The Lions (1-3) will take to the road meeting Hobart at Geneva, N.Y. tomorrow and then stop off at Syracuse for a game with the Orange Saturday.

If Coach Earnie Bear's boys have any hopes of snapping their streak they will have to mount a much stronger offensive attack. In four games the Lions have scored only 19 goals and sophomore Gordon Bennett has nine of them.

Last year Syracuse battered the Lions, 14-7, and the Orange have 11 lettermen back from that squad.

Roy Simmons, who is in his 29th year as head coach, has a well-balanced team that will be

looking for its sixth straight win over State.

Co-captains Mal Tardiff and Bob Hunter combine with two-time letterwinner Frank Kiernan to give the Orange an attack that ranks with the best in the East. The defense is guarded by veterans Ron Winnegrad, Dave Ward and Steve Ornstein, all returning lettermen.

The midfield has been the sore-spot for the Orange this year. The first unit has vets Steve Smallwood, Mark Roadarmel and Pete Page but after that Syracuse is thin.

Hobart, tomorrow's opponent, is a small college in New York that year after year fields a good lacrosse team. The school does not have spring football practice and is able to use some of the football men as lacrosse players.

Hobart was one of State's victims last year, losing to the Nittanians, 11-3.

CHICAGO (AP)—Charlie Grimm yesterday resigned as manager of the Chicago Cubs, and Lou Boudreau, former American League manager and now a Cub broadcaster, was named to succeed Grimm for the balance of the season.

The announcement came shortly after the Cubs won their sixth game against 11 defeats, beating the Pittsburgh Pirates 5-1 behind the five-hit pitching of rookie Dick Ellsworth.

Grimm will replace Boudreau as the color announcer for the Cub games over radio station WGN.

Grimm, 62, had begun his third stint as Cub pilot this season but lasted only 23 days.

Boudreau, 42, last managed for the Kansas City A's from 1955 until he was relieved Aug. 6, 1957.

The switch in management for the last place Cubs was announced jointly by owner P. K. Wrigley of the Cubs and Ward Quaal, vice president and general manager of radio-TV station WGN. Boudreau has served as baseball commentator for WGN.

Cub Vice President John Holland said that a conference was held yesterday between Wrigley, Grimm and himself and it was decided that a managerial change was in order.

Holland said Grimm offered his resignation, which was accepted.

Grimm remains with the club in the office of vice president—a post he held prior to succeeding Bob Scheffing as manager. Scheffing was released after the 1959 campaign.
