

Gibson to Deliver Chapel Sermons Steimle to Speak In Chapel Service

Rev. Sam N. Gibson, executive director of the University Christian Association, will deliver the sermon at two Mother's Day Protestant services at 9 a.m. and 11 a.m. tomorrow in the Helen Eakin Eisenhower Chapel.

Gibson will speak on "Divided Loyalty" Lee Van Bremen, president of the Student Christian Association, will assist him at the services.

The service at 11 a.m. will include the installation of the new SCA officers.

The Meditation Choir, under the direction of James Beach, will supply the music for the services. They will sing the anthem "I, U Worship and Fall Down" by Willan Larry Handwerk which act as organist for the services.

Gibson received his bachelor of science degree in Architecture from the Georgia Institute of Technology and his bachelor of divinity and his master of sacred theology degrees from Yale University's Divinity School.

Dr. Steimle received his bachelor of arts degree from Princeton University, his master of arts degree from the University of Penn-

sylvania and his bachelor of divinity degree from Mt. Airy Seminary (Philadelphia). He also holds honorary degrees from Wagner College and Muhlenberg College.

Dr. Steimle is a native of Allentown. He has spoken on the National Radio Pulpit and the United Lutheran Series of the Protestant Hour. He is currently broadcasting weekly on the NBC Art of Living series.




