Nine Loses to Maryland, **Play at Bucknell Today**

The floundering Lions combined errors (4) with men left on base (14) to give Maryland a 10-6 win. So now Joe Bedenk's "untouchables" are 7-6 and will have to struggle for a winning season.

They can pick up an important win today when they take on Bucknell at Lewisbing, Pa, in the first game of a two-day road trip which finds them at Lehigh tomorrow

Eddle Kikla, the wonder boy of college baseball a year ago, took the loss for Penn State Saturday and his record dropped to 2-S. The junior port-sider lasted only 3's innings, giving up eight hits and nine runs three of which were earned.

Sophomore Dave Bergev relieved him in the fourth and went the rest of the way with some magnificent mound work Making his first appearance of

the campaign, Bergev didn't al-low a hit in 5² i innings of relief and gave up one run which, naturally, was uncarned

Pitching coach Chuck Medlar was quite pleased with Burgey's showing. "For the first time out, he did a real good job. He pitched a smart ball game," said the ex-Texas League star.

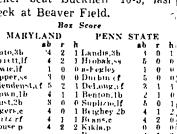
