Seniors to File Payment Terms

All graduating seniors who still owe on their loans under the National Defense Education Act are reminded that they must file a repayment schedule.

This schedule is to be filed by May 18 in the student loan office, 6 Willard.

H. R. Gilbert, processor of student loans, said that seniors planning a teaching career or a tour in military service should acquire a certification that they are eligible for credits before leaving the University.

Students going into teaching may obtain credits up to 50 percent of the total loan. They are obtained at the rate of 10 percent a year.

Students entering the military service may qualify for a grace period of three years on the payment of the principal and interest of their loans.

Pageant Tickets Are Now Available

Tickets for the Miss Centre County pageant, to be held at 8 p.m. today in the Bellefonte Junior High School auditorium, are on sale at Woodring's Floral Gardens in town or from any member of the Jaycees.

Stone Valley Area Will Open in 1961

Construction of the dam across Shaver Creek in the Stone Valley Recreational Area has been completed and the lake is filled, Lawrence J. Perez, who is in charge of constructing the dam, said.

However, the area will not be opened to the student body until 1961, according to Reed Ferguson, director of University Relations. He explained that the lake needed a summer's time to clean itself up. He said it took that long for the twigs and other debris on the bottom of the lake, left over from construction, to float to the top.

The area will be used by the University forestry classes and the other groups that regularly use this area this summer. The camps in the area will still be used for department picnics and by the Outing Club for camping. Other groups that use the area for workshops every year will be able to use them as before, Ferguson said.

The University owns 6400 acres of land in the Stone Valley region. A forestry camp, a civil engineering camp and a mineral industries camp are located in the area. Other research and instructional projects of the school of forestry are located in Stone Valley.
