

Day Set To Honor Civil Rights

The Committee on Inter-Religious Affairs will bring Henry F. Foster and State Senator Jo Hayes to campus on May 17, "Student's Civil Rights Day."

The program, planned to honor the sixth anniversary of the Supreme Court ruling against segregated schools, will be held at 8:15 p.m. at the Wesley Foundation.

Foster is professor of constitutional law at the University of Pittsburgh. His speech will cover "The Constitution and Segregation: How law has responded to social conditions."

A member of the Bar of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania, Foster has taught law at the Universities of Oklahoma and Nebraska. He has argued two briefs on segregated schools, and was a fellow in constitutional law and behavioral science at the University of Chicago last year.

Hayes' part in the program has not yet been announced by the Inter-Religious Affairs Committee.

On May 17, 1954, the United States Supreme Court ruled that separate but equal schools were unconstitutional, thus forcing previously segregated Southern schools to intergrade their classrooms.

"Student's Civil Rights Day" is being recognized with similar programs on campuses across the nation.
