

Khrushchev Tactics Hit By West Europe Press

LONDON (AP)—A mood of no surrender built up in Western Europe yesterday amid a tide of resentment against Nikita Khrushchev for withering peace hopes at the summit.

The chorus of denunciation lately leveled at Washington over the spy plane incident switched smartly to the Soviet Premier's head.

West Plans NATO Talks After Summit

PARIS (AP)—Western diplomats yesterday reported plans are being studied to call an early summit conference of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization.

The purpose of the meeting would be to demonstrate the solidarity of the West in the wake of the East-West summit conference.

Foreign ministers of the United States, Britain and France have tentatively arranged to report today to NATO's permanent council here on the crisis that has hit the Big Four conference. Informants said they also may discuss the proposed meeting of NATO heads of government. There was no indication when or where such a meeting might be held.

The anti-Khrushchev mood was reflected in newspapers of all non-Communist shades of opinion, many of which railed at the Americans last week over the U.S. spy plane incident.

Headlines in Rome and Amsterdam announced "Khrushchev Sabotages Summit." The Berliner Morgenpost proclaimed "Paris Conference on Razor's Edge." The London Star headed its editorial "Wrecker with a Big K."

President Eisenhower was widely praised for his restraint in the face of Khrushchev's browbeating at Monday's crucial meeting.

Commentators acknowledged almost unanimously that Eisenhower had gone to the limit of conciliation in suspending the spy flights.

Kennedy Wins Maryland Race

BALTIMORE (AP)—Sen. John F. Kennedy (D.-Mass.) last night scored an easy, impressive victory in the Maryland presidential primary.

Kennedy jumped to a quick lead over Sen. Wayne Morse (D.-Ore.) and almost every precinct that reported gave him another boost.

Voters could have decided to send an uninstructed delegation to the National Democratic Convention, but this also fared poorly. It drew 11,291.

Mike 'Blunders' Hit

WASHINGTON (AP)—Amid new appeals for a united front, Sen. Mike Mansfield (D-Mont) yesterday demanded a congressional investigation of what he said were Eisenhower administration "blunders."

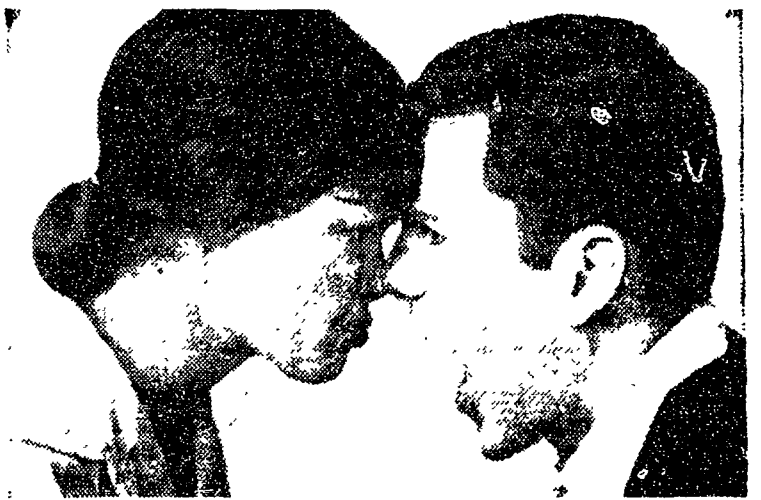
