

# Maryland Smashes Lion Stickmen, 17-2

COLLEGE PARK, Md., May 18—The Penn State lacrosse team played its best ball of the year for three periods here today against Maryland, but fell apart at the seams in the last quarter losing, 17-2.

The Lions held the defending National Champs to a 6-2 halftime lead and a 9-2 third quarter edge before running out of steam and dropping their eighth straight game. The win was Maryland's sixth against two defeats and their 22nd win in 24 games against Penn State.

Coach Earnie Baer said that his Lions played a good game but the Terps had too much reserve strength for State. He credited the Lions' good showing in the first three quarters to the goal-tending of John Castella. The Nittany senior took over for the injured Jim Irwin and had 20 saves, 18 in the first three periods.

Gordon Bennett and Dick Hammond notched State's two goals. After Maryland had scored two quick ones in the opening minutes of play, Hammond fired in the first score at 10:12, blasting in a backhand shot.

In the second period with the Terps leading, 4-1, Bennett took a pass behind the Maryland goal and circled in front of the net and scored on a shot into the corner of the net. Bennett now has scored in every game except one. He was blanked at Hobart.

Jerry Thelen and Fritz Waidner led the Terp assault with five goals apiece. All-American Roger Gross also had a good day. The 6-1 senior broke a Maryland lacrosse record with eight assists and one goal.

Penn State will close out its season Saturday with a home game against Colgate on Beaver Field.

# Cards, Solly Deny Report Of Firing

PITTSBURGH (AP) — Solly Hemus said yesterday he knew nothing about a report he might be ousted as manager of the St. Louis Cardinals.

Commenting on a story by Bob Broeg, sports editor of the St. Louis Post-Dispatch that Hemus might be replaced by either Leo Durocher or Johnny Keane, presently a Redbird coach, Hemus said:

"It's news to me. Nobody connected with the organization has said a word to me about such a possibility."

Cards' owner August A. Busch in St. Louis quickly came to Solly's defense, declaring rumors Hemus is on the way out are "absolutely not true." Busch said Hemus has done "a wonderful job under the circumstances."

In explaining why Hemus, now in his second year at the Cardinal helm, might be ousted, Broeg wrote:

"Hemus may have fallen victim, in part, to his own over-optimism."

"A hustling, all-out, self-made player, Solly apparently hasn't been able to see himself as a manager, but unfortunately he has oversold his ball club to his bosses and to the public. They came to expect too much."

The Cards, winners of only 2 of 15 road games, own an 11-15 record and are in sixth place.

Hemus denied that he oversold the club.

"I said the Cardinals were capable of finishing in the first division," he said, "and I still think they will."

"I also said any club that is capable of finishing in the first division, can go all the way provided it gets the breaks. That's what happened to the Dodgers last year."

## Kemmerer Sold to Sox For Undisclosed Sum

CHICAGO (AP) — The Chicago White Sox yesterday obtained Russ Kemmerer, a right-handed pitcher, from the Washington Senators.

The announcement said Kemmerer's contract was purchased for an undisclosed sum.

Kemmerer has no victories and two defeats in three appearances this season. In the 1959 season with Washington he had an 8-17 record.
