Rev. Seyda will speak on "Doing the Impossible Takes a Little Longer."

German Bishop Will Present Chapel Sermon

Bishop Johannes Lilje, Lutheran bishop of Hannover in West Germany, will speak at the Chapel services at 10:55 a.m. tomorrow in Schwab Auditorium.

Both the University Chapel Choirs, under the direction of Willa Taylor, and the Meditation Chapel Choirs, under the direction of James W. Beach, will provide the music for the services. Tomorrow will be the first time the two groups will participate jointly in the service.

The Meditation Chapel Choirs will sing the Introit, "I to the Hills Will Lift Mine Eyes" from the Ravenscroft's Psalter, 1621, and the Gloria Patri by George Ceiga. They will participate with the congregation and the University Chapel Choir in the singing of Vaughan Williams' setting of the "Old Hundredth."

The University Chapel Choir will sing "Die Mit Tranen Saen" by Hermann Schein as the morning anthem.

The University organist, George Ceiga, will play three compositions by Mendelssohn. "Prelude in C minor" will be followed by "Adagio in A flat" as offertory, and "Fugue in C minor" as postlude.

Bishop Lilje is the president of the United Lutheran Church in Germany and a member of the Central Committee of the World Council of Churches. While he is in this country, he is the Harry Emerson Fosdick visiting professor at Union Theological Seminary.

'Requiem' To Be Sung At Concert

"The Requiem" by Giuseppe Verdi will be presented at 8:30 tonight in Schwab auditorium by the University Chapel Choir and the Symphony Orchestra in their 13th annual spring concert.

Dr. Hugo Weisgall, distinguished visiting professor of music, will be guest conductor for the production.

Soloists who will join the student groups are: Ellen Faull, soprano; Margery Mayer, mezzo-soprano; Vincenzo Siviero, tenor, and Raymond Brown, associate professor of music, baritone.

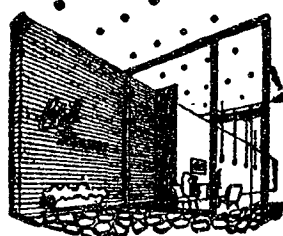
For the first time the University Chapel Choir, under the direction of Willa Taylor, will be an all-faith choir. It will consist of representatives from the Meditation Chapel Choirs and the Roman Catholic and Jewish groups. A total of 213 students will be participating in the concert.

Willa Taylor, co-ordinator for the concert, has been assisted in its preparation by James Beach, director of the Meditation Chapel Choirs, and Theodore Karhan, regular conductor of the University Symphony Orchestra.

The concert is sponsored by the University Chapel, the department of music, and the Committee on Inter-Religious Affairs. Since there is no admission charge, a voluntary contribution will be taken at the close of the program.

Alumni to Participate In 'College' Sessions

Alumni College, the agency through which a program of continuing education is offered to the alumni, will be held in the summer on campus for two weeks and also in the fall in Europe for three weeks.

The summer Alumni College will be held from August 1 to 5 and 8 to 12 and will offer such courses as "Modern Painting," "Modern Fiction" and "Politics 1960," for the alumni. The first-week session will be a study-discussion program, while the second-week session is intended to train the participants to act as discussion leaders.

The fall Alumni College will be held from Oct. 1 to 24 and will be open to a limited group of 20 alumni who have attended previous sessions of the college.

In connection with the theme of the seminar "The Varieties of Western Democracy" the alumni will visit England, Germany, Switzerland and France, more particularly, London, Berlin, Bonn, Berne, Geneva and Paris.

In London, the group will visit the Speakers' Corner in Hyde Park and the Houses of Parliament. Visits to Versailles, the headquarters of NATO and SHAPE, the Louvre and a lecture by a member of the French Foreign Office is included in the program for their five-day stop in Paris.

In Geneva, visits to the International Labor Organization, and the College of Political Sciences are included in the itinerary. In Bonn, the group will meet with representatives of the West German parties, and in Berlin they

will visit the East Berlin sector and a refugee camp.

During the summer prior to the trip the 20 alumni will receive a study kit as preparation for their tour abroad. The kit will include language records, maps, and background material on the political and cultural history and the current affairs of each country to be visited.

Prior to departure they will meet September 9 and 10 on campus to hear lectures, see films and discuss the tour in detail. Robert Iverson, assistant director of Continuing Liberal Education, and Kent Forester, professor of European history, will be the discussion leaders and will also go with the alumni on the trip.

The fall Alumni College is the first college to be held abroad. The Center of Continuing Liberal Education is planning one for the spring of 1961 which will tour Europe under the theme "Varieties of Western Art"
