

Annuity Plan Offered To Personnel

An annuity plan designed to provide supplementary retirement payments was offered to all full-time University personnel yesterday.

The employee accepting the plan contracts directly with the insurance company for this annuity, while the University makes the authorized salary deduction each month.

According to McKay Donkin, vice president for finance, the University does not contribute to the plan. However, he explained, annuity payments are tax-deferred under the Federal Technical Amendments Act of 1958.

In determining the maximum deduction according to a formula, an employee drawing an annual salary of \$6000 could set aside up to \$1000 a year. However, the formula determined amount could not exceed 20 per cent of the employee's total salary for that year.

Donkin said that the plan is now in effect at 26 colleges and universities, including the University of Pennsylvania.

The purchase of additional protection under this plan will not affect the benefits currently accruing to employees through other programs.

The coeds commissioned by Col. Ellis B. The coeds will play an active part in ROTC Brigade affairs.

3 Lecturers Engaged For Grad Series

An economist, a philosopher and an art historian have been engaged to speak at the Graduate Lecture Series for next year.

On Oct. 18, Roy Blough, economist at Columbia, will give the first lecture. Herbert Feigl, philosopher and professor from the University of Minnesota, will deliver the second talk of the series on Nov. 3. Art historian from Harvard, James Ackerman, will present the next scheduled speech on Feb. 21.

According to Dr. Joseph Britton, committee chairman, these speakers are only the ones contracted for the first part of the year; other speakers will be announced when the final contracts are made.

The lectures, open to the public, are held in 121 Sparks at 8 p.m.

Grant to BusAd Will Assist Faculty

A \$1000 grant from the Price Waterhouse Foundation to the College of Business Administration will be used to assist faculty members in their graduate study in accounting.

Similar grants by the foundation have been awarded to the University yearly since 1957, and four faculty members have been assisted in their doctoral study. The funds are used for traveling expenses to the schools where they are working and for similar expenses connected with their graduate study.
