Frank Pearson, former University party clique chairman, called the charges "nebulous" and said that LP members act as individuals and not as a group. "We wouldn't act against student wishes because we, too, are students," he said.

Brandt closed his arguments with further statements that LP had acted consistently as a group for the past decade and that it had acted against student government.

Julius summed up LP's view: "Why would students who have devoted so much time and effort to student government suddenly turned against it in their senior year because of LP?"

According to committee chairman, Lee van Breman, the committee will consider Sunday night's evidence and will also accept any other evidence in written form from anyone who would like to submit it.
