

Blue Band to Give Outdoor Concert

The Penn State Concert Blue Band under the direction of James W. Dunlop, professor in music education, will present an outdoor "Pop" concert at 3 p.m. Sunday on the steps of the Pattee Library.

The Blue Band will open the concert with the national anthem. Next they will present the "Illinois March" by Edwin Goldman, and "Texas Portrait" by Ralph Hermann.

James Shugert, Marshall Spayd and Alan Hess who compose the cornet trio will play "Victoria Waltz" by Leonard Smith, followed by the band's presentation of "Czardas D'Amour" by Gaston Jean and M. Saint Paul.

The clarinet soloist Stanley Bialomizy, will play "Pipe Dream" by Clare Grundman; the solo will be followed by "Clarinet Escapade" by Russell Ward featuring the clarinet section.

Next the band will play "Rakoczy — Marche Hongroise" by Hector Berlioz and arranged by Leonard Smith. Nancy Clouser, marimba soloist, will play "Serenade to a Picket Fence" by Norman Leyden.

Next on the program will be "Avant-Garde Concert March" by William Strickland, selections from "Around the World in Eighty Days" by Victor Young and arranged by Denis Wright, "March of Steel Men" by Charles Delsterling and arranged by Harry Alford, and "Second American Folk Rhapsody" by Clara Grundman.

The "Five Mellow Winds" by David Schanke will be next on the program. The soloists for this will be Stanley Bialomizy, Mark Wilde, John Howe, William Reindel and Jack Anthony.

The band will bring the concert to an end by playing selections from "Take Me Along" by Bob Merrill and arranged by Alfred Reed; and "The Stars and Stripes Forever" by John Phillip Sousa.

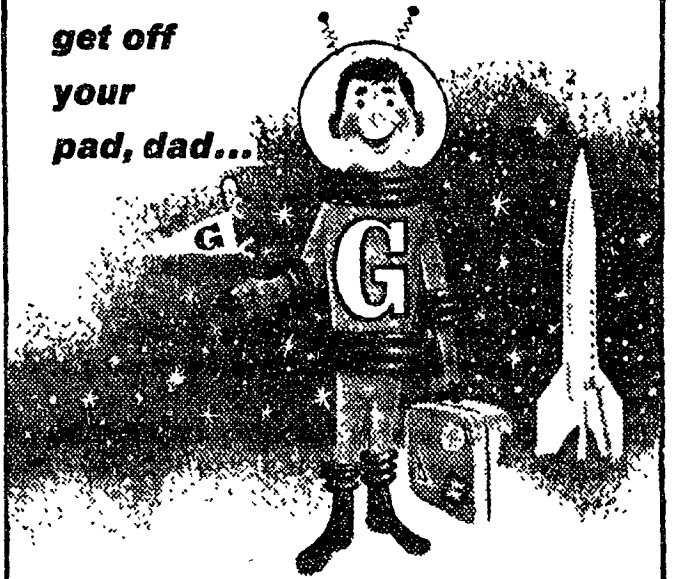
