It's official now, Penn State's baseball season is over and the final game scheduled at Delaware tomorrow has been cancelled

Ed Czekar Business Manager of Athletics confirmed reports that the game had been cancelled becouse Delaware had accepted a bid to play in the District II play-

The playoffs will begin Friday in Cooperstown NY, and Delaware needed Thursday as a travel date, so Penn State athletic officials got together with Delaware's Athletic Director Dave Nelson and they agreed to the cancella-

The Blue Hens will meet Colgate in the opening round at Cooperstown while Villanova will meet St. Johns in the other game. The winner of the two-day

tournament then goes to Omaha, Neb , for the College World Series. Due to the cancellation, State finished the year-with a sub par 9-9 record

The Penn State story (errors and lack of clutch hitting) is well known now, and Lion coach Joe Bedenk and the whole squad already are looking forward to next year when they hope to make up for their poor performance.
