

# Lions Will Defend Title In IC4A's This Weekend

Penn State has two IC4A champions who won't get a chance to defend their titles tomorrow and Saturday at Villanova.

Dick Engelbrink, winner of the 2-mile last year, and Bob Szezyler, the IC4A 220 low hurdles champ, will be participating, but not in these events.

Both the 2-mile and the 220 low hurdles have been replaced this year with special Olympic events—the steeplechase, hop-step-and-jump, and 440-yard hurdles.

Szezyler will switch to the 440-yard hurdles and Engelbrink will run both the mile and the 880.

Other top entries for the Lions are Bob Brown in the 100 and 220, Dick Hambright in the 440, Dick Campbell and John Fariera in the high jump, Jim Schwab in the javelin, Jon Musser in the discus, and Mel Ramey in the hop-step-and-jump.

Three Penn Staters, Mike Miller, Steve Moorhead, and Ernie Noll will try their luck in the steeplechase.

A host of track stars from 47 schools throughout the East and midwest also will be appearing in the meet. Boston U's John Thomas should be the top individual attraction, but the track prognosticators can't make up their minds whether Villanova, Yale, Penn State, Manhattan, Maryland or Michigan State will win the team title.

Even Harvard, on the strength of a 70-70 tie with Yale, is considered a contender.

Villanova, with a solid corps of sprinters, two top hurdlers, and a 24-foot plus broad jumper, is the favorite. Frank Budd (who edged Brown in the IC4A indoor 60-yard dash title race) and Paul Drayton are top contenders in both the 100 and 220.

Leon Pras and Bob Coffill are rated as top-notch hurdlers, and John Buckley has won the broad jump title for two consecutive years.

Berks House downed the Mice, 1-0, to win the independent title.

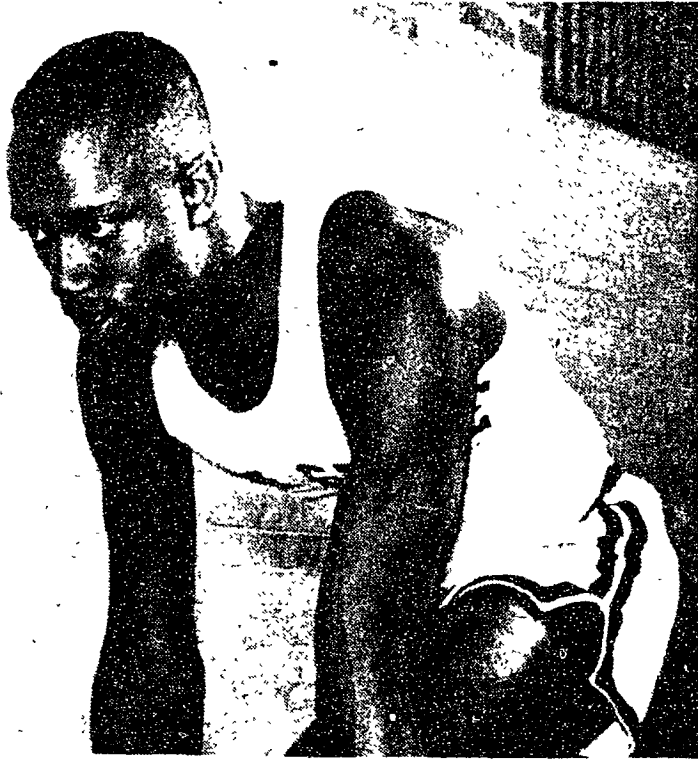

# Orioles Retain Lead On Courtney's Single

CHICAGO (AP) — Clint Courtney's pinch single in the ninth inning drove in the decisive run that gave the league leading Baltimore Orioles a 3-2 victory over the sliding Chicago White Sox yesterday.

Boosting Baltimore to its fourth straight triumph and 19th in the last 27 games was rookie righthander Chuck Estrada. Estrada, who had a 14-6 mark for Vancouver last year, bested Early Wynn for his third victory against one setback.

Estrada scattered five hits, including a game-tying homer by Sherm Lollar in the seventh, fanned six and walked four.

Wynn, striving for his third straight victory, went the route for the second time and was nicked for 10 hits in absorbing his second loss. He struck out 8.

Sox shortstop Luis Aparicio was spiked in the third inning when Val Thomas was out stealing second. Aparicio had to leave the game in the seventh.

Rookie Sox centerfielder Joe Hicks collided in short center with Sammy Esposito as they chased Jackie Brandt's pop fly in the eighth. Hicks was knocked out and left the game.

## Tigers Tame Yankees

DETROIT (AP) — Charlie Maxwell, Frank Bolling and Red Wilson supported Frank Lary's pitching with bases-loaded doubles yesterday, helping the Detroit Tigers to a 9-3 triumph over the New York Yankees.

Lary spaced eight hits in running his lifetime mark against New York to 22-7 and helped his own cause with a run-scoring double in the eighth inning. Lary's record is 4-3.

By winning their fourth straight and their 10th in the last 14 games, the Tigers moved into a fourth-place tie with New York. Each team has a 15-14 record. The Yankees now have dropped

five of eight games in the West. They sent four pitchers into yesterday's contest with starter Ralph Terry, who was knocked out in the third, taking the defeat.

## Boston Breaks Streak

KANSAS CITY (AP) — The Boston Red Sox staved off an eighth inning rally and broke a 10-game losing streak yesterday by shattering Kansas City Athletics 5-3.

Manager Billy Jurges used three pitchers in the eighth and Tom Borland ended it by striking out Ken Hamlin with the tying run on second base.

Bill Monbouquette, the starting Red Sox right-hander, was the winner and brought his record to 4-3. He had a 3-0 lead and had allowed only three hits when the A's drove him out with a two run burst in the seventh inning.

After Ted Bowsfield got the side out and the Red Sox had scored another run in the eighth, the Athletics struck again. Pinch-hitter Bill Tuttle started it with a single. After Norm Siebern had struck out, Hank Bauer singled and Bowsfield was relieved by Mike Fornieles. Harry Chiti greeted him with a single that drove in Tuttle and moved Bauer to second. Jurges then sent Borland to the mound and he got Pete Daley on a fly to center before whiffing Hamlin.

Five runners share Penn State's 100-yard dash record with a time of 9.6. They are Hi Henry (1907), Dick Bartholomew (1928), Barney Ewell (1940), Wilbert Lancaster (1950), and Art Pollard (1954).
