

### Graduate Students Honor Dr. Davison

Dr. Hugh M. Davison, professor of educational research at the University, was honored at a banquet Wednesday by graduate students and faculty members of the College of Education for his valuable assistance in the graduate program and research studies of the College over the past decade.

In addition to a gift of an attache case, Dr. Davison was given a tape recording of the program, which included short talks and the presentation of a scroll.

Dr. Davison has been a member of the faculty since 1948 and has supervised the writing of hundreds of theses and dissertations in the field of education in that time.

## AFL-CIO Opens 1st Institute

Members of the AFL-CIO, opening the first annual community service institute on the Penn State Campus yesterday, began intensive studies of community service programs that they can each initiate in their local unions. Over 160 union men from all over Pennsylvania will hear speakers, discussions, and planned projects as part of this week long convention.

Directed by Helmut J. Goltz, assistant professor of industrial relations, and Charles F. Ferguson, executive secretary of Pennsylvania CIO community services, the institute will present new ideas for future planning in local unions.

One union in Bucks County initiated its labor union to provide an eye care center. It also was a major force in getting a new hospital.

Leo Perlis, the national director of AFL-CIO community service activities, said in the opening speech yesterday that Pennsylvania unions have the most effective community services program in the country.

The objectives set forth previous to the institute are to acquaint members with community health and welfare facilities, to promote the use of public and voluntary welfare agencies, to encourage and train members for community participation, to advocate voluntary fund raising through appeals at the state and local levels, and

to work actively with others in community groups.

The over-all purpose is to persuade and educate others to the values of community service through unions.

The following speakers are included in the week's program: Leo Perlis, national director of AFL-CIO community service activities; Ruth Grigg Horting, secretary of the Department of Public Welfare of Pennsylvania; Anne X. Alpern, Attorney General; and Allen Sulcove, executive director of the State Bureau of Employment Security.

### Seminar Group To Tour Europe

The European Seminar, sponsored by the University Christian Association, and led by Miss Genevieve Dilts, associate director of the U.C.A., and Dr. Owen Sauerlender, professor of Economics at Penn State, left from New York's Idlewild Airport Wednesday for seven weeks in Europe.

The Seminar group consists of 16 students from Penn State and several other campuses throughout the nation. They will fly first to England where they will participate in a 3-day orientation program at Cambridge University prior to their tour in Europe. From Cambridge they will go to London for several days, and then to Paris.

Their itinerary includes Germany, Holland, East Berlin, Czechoslovakia, Austria, Italy and Switzerland.

The program includes lectures and discussions with leaders in politics, education, art, and the church, as well as visits to refugee camps, art museums, the headquarters of NATO and UNESCO, and other places of interest in contemporary Europe.

## Prexy Talks About Value Of Research

University President Eric A. Walker, who is president-elect of the American Society for Engineering Education, Wednesday told a luncheon session of the Society's 68th annual meeting at Purdue University that research and good engineering teaching are inseparable.

"Real teaching," the President told an assembly of young engineering teachers, "requires that the teacher himself be engaged in exploration with ideas, systems of thinking, formulas, and theories—engaged, that is, in exploration of the frontiers of knowledge."

President Walker conceded that the professor who is doing this sort of research may not be publishing—"but," he added, "it is research—and very valuable research."

Earlier, in a panel discussion on "The Technical Institute in America," President Walker contended that institutions with unassailable reputations for academic excellence have an obligation to lend their prestige and support to two-year and other non-four year programs in engineering education.

"Programs of this sort are needed," he explained, "if we are to prove our responsibility to provide the best possible education for all young men and women at the highest level at which each boy and girl can profit. The impetus for changing the present attitude against such programs," he concluded, "must come from within engineering and engineering education."

(Continued from page one) manding a non-communist affidavit.

The proposal had the approval of President Eisenhower and Vice President Nixon. Eisenhower has called the affidavit "unwarranted" and "justifiably resented by a large part of our educational community."

When the bill was approved Feb. 2 by the Senate Committee on Labor and Public Welfare, Kennedy said the affidavit is "unworkable, ineffective, and unnecessary."

The affidavit is not required of farmers or homeowners.

Scott said on March 21 that he did not think the oath did as much "as it is alleged to do," but "it is discriminatory and should apply to everyone" receiving federal aid or else be abolished.

Scott added that he thought "it would be better to get rid of it."
