

# Mexican Holds Golf Lead; Palmer Third With 141

ST. ANDREWS, Scotland (AP)—A second straight 67 sent long-hitting Roberto De Vincenzo of Mexico into the halfway lead of the British Open Golf Championship with 134 yesterday. Arnold Palmer was in a familiar spot—seven shots back.

# Alston Taps 5 Additional Buc Stars

CINCINNATI (AP)—Manager Walter Alston's snub of Milwaukee pitching aces Warren Spahn and Lew Burdette in his 1960 National League All-Star plans was regarded yesterday in some circles as a slap at Charlie Dressen, his former coach at Los Angeles.

The omission of the Braves' pitchers was as striking as the inclusion of Stan Musial, the grand veteran of St. Louis' Cardinals for the 17th time.

Along with Musial, Alston named a 12-man cast to supplement the starting team selected by the players last week.

Alston's additions are catchers Ed Bailey of Cincinnati and Smoky Burgess of Pittsburgh; infielders Ken Boyer and Bill White of St. Louis, Dick Groat of Pittsburgh, Norm Larker and Charlie Neal of Los Angeles, and Tony Taylor of Philadelphia; and outfielders Orlando Cepeda of San Francisco, Roberto Clemente of Pittsburgh and Vada Pinson of Cincinnati.

Alston named 10 pitchers for the two All-Star clashes against the American Leaguers. The first game will be played at Kansas City next Monday, the second in New York Wednesday.

Three of the pitchers — Vern Law, Bob Friend and Elroy Face — are Pirates. The others are Mike McCormick of San Francisco, Larry Jackson and Lindy McDaniel of St. Louis, Bob Buhl of Milwaukee, Bill Henry, Johnny Podres and Stan Williams of the Dodgers.

## NFL Moves Office

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — The National Football League office will open its new headquarters in New York City next Monday, Commissioner Pete Roselle announced yesterday. The office has been in Philadelphia since late 1946.

Can the daring young professional from Latrobe, Pa., duplicate his miracle comebacks of the Masters and U.S. Open tournaments?

Entering today's 38-hole show-down, De Vincenzo, a transplanted Argentine, held a two-stroke edge over Kel Nagle, a one-time mill worker from Australia, who added a 67 to a previous 69 for 136.

Then came Palmer at 141, after a frustrating second round of 71. He was tied with Peter Thomson of Australia, who registered a 69 and surprising Sebastian Miguel of Spain, who rallied with a brilliant 68.

Palmer was dejected after his round which for the second straight day saw him play near-perfect golf from tee to green only to see his hopes dissipated on the greens.

Two players were tied at 142 — Fidel deLuca of Argentina, with a 69-73, and L. B. Ayton of England, 73-69.

Defending champion Gary Player of South Africa, fighting putting miseries, was one of five at 143 after a shaky 71, and he said: "I'll putt this course's eyes out tomorrow — I'm confident I'll win."

With warm, almost windless weather prevailing, it took a score of 149 or better to qualify for Friday's final rounds, limited to a maximum of 50. Par for this venerable layout is 36-37-73.

## N.Y. City May Get 2nd Baseball Team

NEW YORK (AP) — The New York World-Telegram said yesterday there has been a dramatic switch of opinion in the National League pointing to the return of a National League team to New York City.

New York lost the Giants to San Francisco and the Brooklyn Dodgers to Los Angeles after the 1957 season.

New York would regain a team, if it happens, through expansion of the National League to 10 teams.

## Navy, Syracuse Lead Olympic Rowing Trials

SYRACUSE, N. Y. (AP)—California, Navy's varsity and the Syracuse Alumni Rowing Assn. won their qualifying heats in three spectacular eight-oared races at the Olympic rowing trials on Onondage Lake yesterday.

The big eights climaxed the first day of the three-day program with rousing finishes that drew cheers from some 2,000 spectators watching on a bright sunny day.


With the first two in each of the three heats qualifying for Friday's semi-finals, California nipped Cornell's varsity shell by 15 feet, Navy's varsity entry edged Cornell's junior varsity by seven feet, and Syracuse beat Navy's previously unbeaten plebes by about 30 feet in the third heat.

Thus Navy and Cornell each placed two crews into the eight-oared semi-finals.


All races in the eights and the other six classes were over the Olympic distance of 2,000 meters — 1 1/4 miles.
