

2 New Plays To Open At Mateer, Boal Barn

Starting next week two new productions will be presented to area theatregoers. "A Streetcar Named Desire" at the Mateer Playhouse and "Love Rides the Rails" at the Boal Barn Playhouse.

The Mateer Playhouse production of "A Streetcar Named Desire," Tennessee Williams' Pulitzer Prize-winning play, is scheduled for a two-week run starting on Monday, July 11.

The play is directed by Max Fischer and will star Esther Benson in her only appearance of the season. Also featured in leading roles will be David Frank, Patricia Thompson and Ronald Bishop.

Esther Benson will play the part of a tortured and tormented woman Blanche DuBois who comes to live with her animal-like brother-in-law at his home in the French Quarter of New Orleans. David Frank will play the brother-in-law Stanley Kowalski.

Patricia Thompson will play Kowalski's understanding wife, and Ronald Bishop, a family friend. Others in the cast are Ann Driscoll, Frank Browning, William Mooney and Scott Webster. Curtain time will be at 8:40 p.m.

"Love Rides the Rails" which is subtitled "Will the Mail Train Run Tonight," is a melodrama by Moreland Carey and is set in Centre County. It is scheduled to run two weekends at Boal Barn, Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights starting on Thursday, July 14.

It is an old time melodrama featuring a dastardly villain who is trying to gain control of a railroad and a beautiful heroine while a rickety piano is providing background music.

Joe Servello plays the villain and Nancy Wilder is the heroine. The inevitable pure hero is played by Bert Berdis. Glenn Sheffer plays the hero's sidekick and Steve Schlow the villain's sidekick.

Steel Institute Gives \$10,000 for Fellowships

Funds from the American Iron and Steel Institute, totaling \$10,000 this year will support three graduate fellows in geochemistry or metallurgy and an additional \$20,200 will be devoted to a research project.

The research is in the field of high temperature chemistry and mineralogy as applied to oxide systems. It is basic research applicable to many types of problems in geology, ceramics and metallurgy.

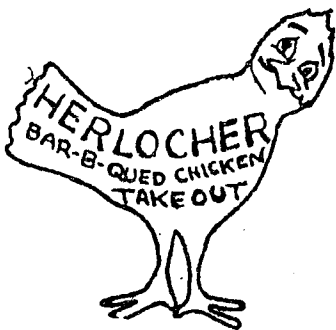
