



STIMULATING AND REFRESHING was the speech delivered in Schwab Tuesday by Gerald L. Wendt, former dean of the College of Chemistry and Physics, now with UNESCO.

Wendt Advocates Change in Education

"Today's children must be built into the 21st century model and educated to face change," said Gerald L. Wendt of the United Nations Economic, Social and Cultural Organization in Schwab auditorium yesterday.

Wendt, a former Dean of the College of Chemistry and Physics at the University, addressed the first general session of the 38th annual School Administrators Conference on the theme "The Scene in the Sixties."

"It doesn't make good sense to prepare our children just for the next war or to get jobs in the '70s," Wendt told an assemblage of state school superintendents and principals.

"All our attitudes are going to change and science is going to be at the bottom of it."

Concepts of ancient times do not appeal to children. For example, our concept of heaven must be modernized, he said.

"It is not within the four dimensions we know. You can no longer tell children heaven is up there or in the sky, this is an illusion. It will be found in a fifth or sixth or seventh dimension," he said.

Wendt said that Russian schools he has observed are superior to American schools

and challenged American educators to revamp the educational attitude.

"If we continue our parochial, provincial and even nationalistic attitude, we'll drop far behind even in the 60's."

Wendt also said that advancements in medicine, increasing the average life span, mean that youngsters must be educated for their later years.

He continued to emphasize free time by citing the shortening work week brought about by increased technology.

"Work is not a Christian virtue as previously considered by many," he said. "Anything a machine can do is beneath man's dignity. We are still in the infancy of the development of the human race."

"It will soon not be a question of how people spend their money but how they spend their time," he said.

James W. Beach, assistant director of the University Choir will direct the summer choir. The choir is composed of summer session students and other interested people.

They will sing as an Introit, "I to the Hills Will Lift Mine Eyes," from the Scottish Psalter; the anthem will be "Call to Remembrance" by Farrant.
