

Augustine Observes Soviet Ed Changes

While the United States is worried about revamping its education system in line with that of Russia, the Soviets are evidently trying to pattern their system after the U.S., according to Dr. P. H. Augustine, supervisor of elementary education and consultant for the Northwestern School district in Erie County and a summer session instructor at the University.

Their Minister of Education suffixed everything he said about the Soviet education system with "like you Americans," said Dr. Augustine.

"He said, 'We now have 10 years of schooling, but we are aiming for 12, like you Americans.'"

"We want every child to have the same education, like you Americans."

Dr. Augustine, who took an individual tour of Russian schools in the Moscow area, related his experiences at a luncheon meeting of Iota Alpha Delta, counseling education fraternity, in the Hetzel Union building yesterday.

"The Soviets applaud high academic standards," said Dr. Augustine, who met one student who got his room, board and books free plus 700 rubles (about \$175) per month.

"Every high school student gets on-the-job training," he said. "They have to work one or two days a week and more if they have a light academic load."

"They have special schools where all classes (not just the language) are taught in French and English."

"They can learn English in either the British or American brogue, but they all speak American on the streets."

He said it is reported that this is so because they listen to Radio Free Europe at home.

Dr. Augustine said he was disappointed to find out that the American government inhibits correspondence between American and Russian students. He said he was told by Central Intelligence Agency officials that any American found on a Russian's correspondence list could never get a job in Washington.

Dr. Augustine, who is also a minister, said that although Christians are persecuted, the few

churches in Moscow are jammed for every service, even though those who enter, in effect, lose their citizenship.

He said he met a noted Christian dental clinician and a doctor who both said as soon as there are enough Communists to fill their professions, they will be cleaning streets to survive.

5 Professors Select Books For Students

Five professors at the University have formulated into a growing business an idea that arose from a need for better selected reading materials that will help to broaden the scope of certain courses on the high school level.

They have developed Uni-Kits, which are collections of about 25 books, planned and built around a specific unit of study for use by teachers as background and reference material for integrating special concepts into regular high school courses.

Dr. M. Jerome Weiss, assistant professor of education, supervises the editing of the kits and four other faculty members collaborating the kits and writing teachers' guides.

They are Dr. James Gemmell, professor of education; Dr. William J. Page, assistant professor of education; Dr. H. Seymour Fowler, associate professor of nature and science education, and Dr. Burton E. Voss, assistant professor of education.

Novels, histories and other non-fiction are included in the five kits already published on the subjects of "Family Finance," "Living Things and Their Environment," "The Space Frontier," "Conservation of Natural Resources," and "America and War."

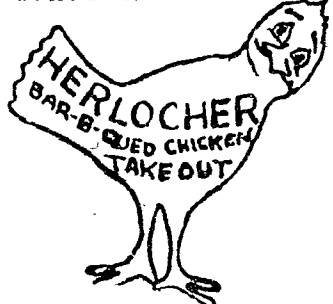

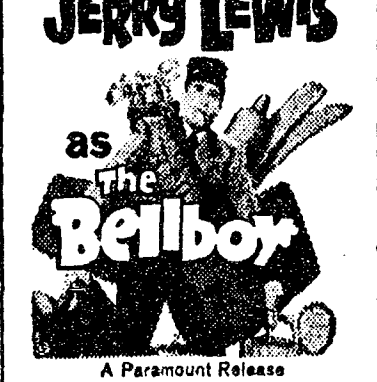
