

Indians to Discuss Piersall's Wrangles

NEW YORK (AP) — The Cleveland players will meet with manager Joe Gordon today to discuss what should be done about Jimmy Piersall, the Indians' temperamental center fielder, who has been in a number of wrangles with umpires this season.

Sixteen Penn State football lettermen will return this season to provide the nucleus for coach Rip Engle's 11th Nittany Lion squad.

The 16 veterans will be headed by guard Bill Popp, Steelton; and end Bob Mitinger, Greensburg; center Jay Huffman, Clairton; quarterback Dick Hoak, Jeanette; and halfback Jim Kerr, St. Clairsville, Ohio. These men were starters on the 1959 team which compiled a 9-2 record including a 7-0 Liberty Bowl win over Alabama. Hoak started at left halfback last year.

Other holdover lettermen slated to report for '60 combat are end and captain-elect Henry Oppermann, Conneville; ends Dave Alexander, New Castle, and John Bozick, Centerville; tackle Stew Barber, Bradford, and guard Wayne Berfeld, who lettered at center two years ago and missed the '59 campaign because of injuries.

Center Dick Wilson, Peckskill, N.Y.; quarterback Galen Hall, Williamsburg; halfbacks Roger Kochman, Wilkensburg; Ed Caye, Pittsburgh, and Dick Pae, Dauphin; and fullback Sam Sobczak, DuBois.

Piersall has been barred from the meeting. He was in Boston yesterday where he was given some "fatherly advice" a \$100 fine by American League President Joe Cronin as a result of being ejected from last Saturday's game between the Indians and Red Sox. It was Piersall's sixth ejection this season.

"I don't know what the outcome will be," said Kuenn. "But the players feel something should be done about the Piersall situation."

"We're all in sympathy with Jimmy but it's reached a point where his antics on the field and his constant wrangles with the umpires, has the fellows pretty well upset. To a certain extent, it's hurting the team."

"It's not our purpose to ask for restrictive measures against Piersall. We didn't want him benched, or sent home, or any such thing. After all, he's having a great year and we want him in the lineup."

"But something should be done about him. We want to see if we can come up with some sort of remedy."

Piersall suffered a mental breakdown in 1952, when he was a member of the Red Sox. Cronin, then general manager of the Red Sox, helped him during that crisis.

Giants Scheduled To Tour Japan

NEW YORK (AP) — The San Francisco Giants of the National Baseball League will make a 16-game tour of Japan between Oct. 16 and Nov. 18, the office of Commissioner Ford C. Frick said yesterday.

Frick conferred with Japanese baseball officials prior to making the announcement. All-star players chosen from Japan's two pro leagues will furnish the opposition. The tour, Frick's office said, has been indorsed by the Japanese government and the U.S. State Department.

Lions' Record Tops '60 Rivals

Penn State owns a combined record of 79 victories, 61 defeats, and 12 ties with its 1960 football opponents.

Of the nine teams on this fall's schedule, only Pittsburgh and Army hold the upper hand over the Nittany Lions. The Panther's 22-7 victory last year was their 33rd since 1893 in a series which shows 23 Penn State triumphs and three ties.

The best State has managed against Army since 1899 is two victories (in the series opener and last season) and a pair of ties. The Cadets have won six games.

Five 1960 opponents — Boston University, Missouri, Illinois, Maryland, and Holy Cross — will seek their initial win over Penn State. The Nittany Lions have defeated BU six times, Missouri once, Illinois twice, Maryland six times and Holy Cross five times.

Maryland will return to the schedule for the first time since 1944.

The 39-year-old rivalry with Syracuse is a nip-and-tuck affair. The Lions have 17 wins, while Syracuse's 20-18 verdict last year was its 15th. The teams have played to five ties.

Penn State has beaten West Virginia 16 times. The Mountaineers own seven wins. Their last one came in 1955. A 1958 14-14 standoff was the second tie in the series which got underway in 1904.
