

Penna. HS Grid Team Meets National All-Stars

HERSHEY, Pa. (AP) — Pennsylvania's reputation for producing football talent gets its third and severest test from a select group of National High School All Stars here Saturday night.

The Pennsylvania squad officials took a look at the National team in drills Wednesday and said it should be as a six-point favorite.

Lions Expect Tackle Problem On 1960 Squad

Tackle looms as one of the trouble spots on the Penn State's 1960 football squad.

Graduation took three of the Nittany Lion's top four 1959 tackles, with Stew Barber, a converted end, the lone returning letterman. Missing will be Andy Stynchula, a unanimous all-East first team choice, Charlie Janerette, and Tom Mulraney.

Jim Smith, a 6-2, 230-pounder who played a total of 32 minutes last season, appears most likely to get a starting assignment along with Barber. The second unit jobs probably will go to 6-5, 230-pound Charlie Sieminski, a varsity holdover with no playing time in 1959, and either Terry Monaghan or Harrison Rosdahl, both members of last year's freshman squad. Monaghan weighs 223 pounds, Rosdahl 220.

Coach Rip Engle may switch 210-pound Dick Wilson from center to tackle. He'll also look for help from newcomers Jerry Farkas (228), Dave Robinson (220), Russ Schleiden (196), and Ron Tietjns (217).

DuMars to Stretch 'Little Man' Record

Mark DuMars, already highest scoring "little man" in Penn State basketball history, will have one more campaign in which to embellish his impressive record.

The 5-10 backcourt wizard will enter the 1960-61 campaign with a two-season total of 805 points. He scored 337 points with a 16.8 average as a sophomore, and last season placed among the national leaders with 468 and a 21.3 average.

The Sharon sharp-shooter and ace play-maker has his sights set on All-American laurels in his senior season.

This was normal procedure prior to the first two games of the series, after which the Pennsylvania youngsters, "The Big 33," went out and won, 6-0, and 18-0.

But this year, the pre-game fears seem well-founded in the face of the All-Stars' size 211 pound line and speed.

The all-stars' hopes are grounded in the talents of two able quarterbacks, Jay Wilkinson of Norman, Okla., son of Bud Wilkinson, University of Oklahoma coach, and Jerry Rhome of Dallas, Tex.

Bo Sherman, former George Washington University head coach, is coaching the National team.

The Keystone State club will have 192-pound Rick Leeson of Scott Twp., one of the outstanding backs in the state last year, running at fullback. The Nationals' scouts have dubbed the western Pennsylvania boy one of the best they've ever seen.

Besides Leeson, snavely tentatively plans to start Jim Kelly, Clairton, and Lou Fogle, Franklin, at ends; Roland Mudd, Braddock, and Grey Berrier, Harrisburg, Penn, tackles; Lou Shimoski, Bath, and Paul Fedor, Lancaster, guards; Pete Goimmarac, Charleroi, center; Gary Hogan, Charleroi; tailback; Ron Alexander, New Castle, blocking back, and Charlie Weaver, Easton, wingback.

'60 Team 'Adequate Size' Penn State's 1960 football team, says coach Rip Engle, will have "adequate size." The line will average approximately 210 pounds, the backfield 184.
