The patent, No. 2,938,484, was granted to David C. Garland, assistant professor of engineering research in the Ordnance Research Laboratory, who explained that the device is useful in hoisting torpedoes during loading or removal operations in submarines.

Alumni Will Offer Special Program

The Alumni College of the University will offer a select program of liberal studies for alumni who want to combine informal study with vacation on the campus during the first two weeks in August.

As a part of the University's overall program in continuing liberal education, two sessions will be conducted, Aug. 1-6 and Aug. 8-12, with classes from 9 to 12 a.m. and free time in the afternoon and evening.

Five courses will be offered during the first session. The second session will be devoted entirely to leadership training.

Alumni may register for either or both of the sessions, according to Dr. Ralph W. Condee, assistant director for humanities of the University's Center for Continuing Liberal Education.

Dr. Condee will teach a course in Modern Fiction during the first session.

Other courses offered are Politics, 1960, taught by Dr. Robert W. Iverson, assistant director for the social sciences; Introduction to the Humanities, by Dr. Harrison T. Meserole, assistant professor of English literature.

Ways of Mankind, by Dr. Kenneth Beittel, associate professor of art education.

Over 100 alumni are expected to attend. The Alumni College has offered four sessions on campus since its inception in 1958. The last was held in April with about 30 persons attending the program on "America as a Civilization: The Public Philosophy."
