

Claremont String Quartet To Take World Tour

A world-wide tour awaits the Claremont String Quartet following their summer stay at the University.

The instrumental group, which has been a quartet-in-residence at the University for the last three summers, is scheduled for a brief stopover at the Vancouver Music Festival in Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada, before starting around the globe.

The quartet will fly first to Hawaii, then the South Pacific with stops scheduled in the Fiji Islands, New Zealand and Australia.

After leaving the continent down under, they will hit southeast Asia and cross the Mid-East to Europe, where they will play in famed old concert halls in Switzerland, France, Holland and England.

About 75 concerts are already booked for the traveling musicians. They will play contemporary and standard repertoire.

When the quartet reaches the U.S. again, it will make a cross-country tour, winding up on the West Coast sometime next spring.

The inception of the quartet came in 1953 when the members of the group met socially in New York City while each was playing with other groups.

The violinists Vladimir Weisman and Marc Gottlieb were originally from New York, while cellist Irving Klein, and William Schoen, viola, migrated from Cleveland, Ohio.

The quartet has dropped all outside activities since its formation. "Working as a concert group

is the only thing we'll do for the rest of our lives, barring any catastrophies," said Gottlieb, spokesman for the group.

All members of the quartet are married, but Klein has the only family—two children.

The quartet has already made several nation-wide tours, and recorded for three record companies.

They first came to Penn State in the summer of 1958, to serve as quartet-in-residence. Prior to that they taught music for two years at the University of Delaware.

The quartet gives concerts each Tuesday evening at 8 in the Hetzel Union ballroom.

Final Sing at Schwab Will Be Held Tonight

The last student sing of the summer will be held at 8 tonight in Schwab. The sing has been part of student life at Penn State for the past thirty years.

The singing will be accompanied on the piano by Dr. Hummel Fishburn, head of the department of music, and Elmer G. Wareham, instructor in music.

Mueller Gets Grant Renewal

Dr. Erwin W. Mueller, research professor of physics, will continue his research on metal crystals under the renewal of a grant from the Air Force.

Wright Air Development Division of the Air Research and Development Command has announced a grant of \$21,800 to Dr. Mueller to support this research during the coming year.

Dr. Mueller is utilizing his field ion microscope, with which it is possible to observe atomic structures, in his study of "whiskers," or metal crystals that sometimes grow in the form of fine hairs or needles.

The research is of special interest, he explains, because these whiskers exhibit much greater mechanical strength than the common forms of metals. The reason for this strength is not thoroughly understood, and the purpose of Dr. Mueller's investigations is to reveal the atomic structure of these crystals, especially the occurrence of certain structural defects such as dislocations and vacancy clusters.

Ed Prof Writes Article On Learning Principles

Dr. Gerald M. Torkelson, associate professor of education, has written an article appearing in "Child Guidance in Christian Living" entitled "Audio-Visual Materials and the Principles of Learning."

In this publication of the General Board of the Methodist Church, Dr. Torkelson sets up a series of questions which will serve as guidelines for judging the effectiveness of instructional programs in church schools.

Goldberg Appointed Director of Hillel

Rabbi Norman T. Goldberg has been appointed director of the B'nai B'rith Hillel Foundation at the University.

Goldberg will leave his position as rabbi of the Congregation of Agudath Jacob in Waco, Texas, and come to the University at the end of August.

Goldberg, who was born in Chicago, received his bachelor's degree in mathematics from Roosevelt University in Chicago. He was ordained at the Hebrew Theological College in 1951.

While in Chicago, Goldberg served as principal of the Preparatory Division, South Side Branch, of the Hebrew Theological College and taught courses in Talmud, Hebrew, Bible and history.

In March of 1952, Goldberg entered the Army Chaplaincy and served at Fort Keonard Wood and for 18 months in Korea. He received the Bronze Star shortly before his discharge in 1954.

In March of 1954 Goldberg accepted his Waco position. While there, he served on boards and as officers of the Goodwill Industries, the Mental Health Society and the Waco Inter-racial Council.

A specialist in adult education methods, Goldberg also served on the boards of the Jewish Welfare Council and Jewish War Veterans. From 1958 to 1960 he was president of the B'nai B'rith Zionist Organization of America.

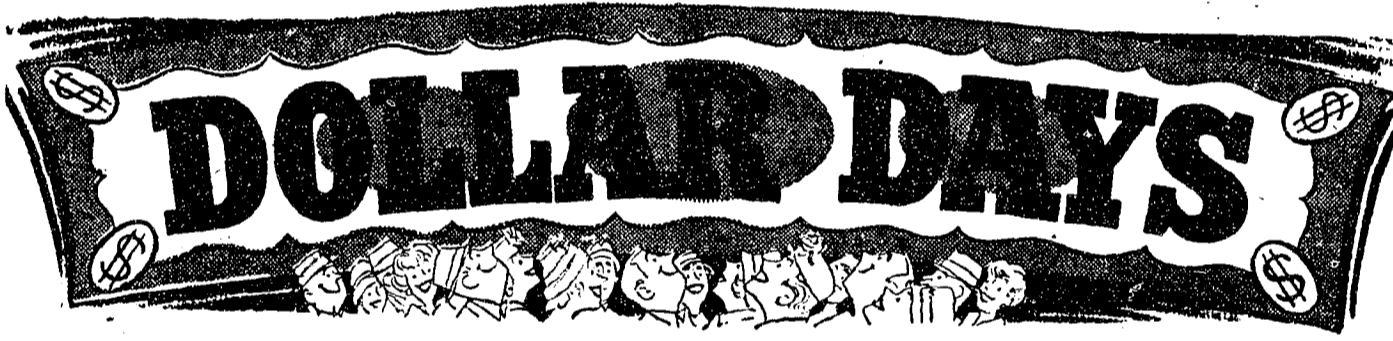
Goldberg recently completed a

Rabbi and Mrs. Goldberg have two children, aged 5 and 3.

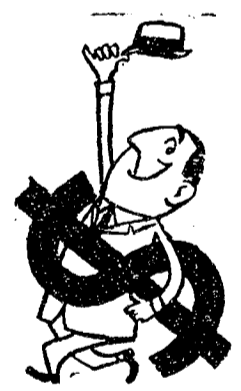
