Seabee Profs Promote Unit For Area Men

Two assistant professors at the University who are former Naval officers are trying to form a Seabee reserve construction battalion in this area.

Allen F. Dill and Gifford H. Albright are asking anyone interested in the formation of a Seabee reserve unit to contact them at UN 5-6394 during the day or at AD 8-0363 in the evening or by mail at P.O. Box 675, State College.

Former Seebies, Naval reservists or ex-Navy men, who are now engaged in construction-type activities, would be eligible to join or transfer to the proposed new unit, Dill said.

At least three officers and 20 enlisted men are needed for the formation of the battalion, he said. It would be a paying unit, meeting one night a week or one weekend a month, whichever plan was most acceptable. Training would also include a two-week summer program. Construction ratings would hold true in the outfit, he said.

If formed, it would probably be supported initially out of Altoona or Williamsport, Dill said.
