

Bucknell, PSU Give Coop Graduate Grant

John F. Bernacki, of Euclid, O. is the first student to study at the University under the new cooperative Graduate Housefellow program, developed by Bucknell University and Penn State.

Under a Bucknell grant, Bernacki will study for his master's degree at Penn State during the summer months and commute for additional classes once a week during the regular academic year while serving as Graduate Housefellow on the Bucknell campus. He will take nine credits of his work at Bucknell.

As a Graduate Housefellow at Bucknell, he will supervise activities of graduate proctors, assist in the social counseling program for fraternities and undertake research projects in the area of student personnel.

Upon completing the cooperative program, he will receive his master's degree from Penn State.

The program was worked out jointly by Charles A. Meyn, dean of men at Bucknell University, and A. M. Wellington, professor of counselor education at Penn State. Bucknell will provide the educational experiences and Penn State most of the professional courses.

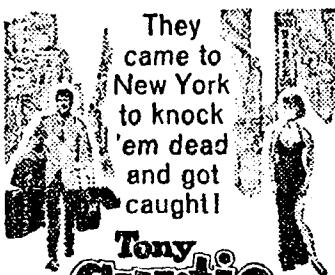

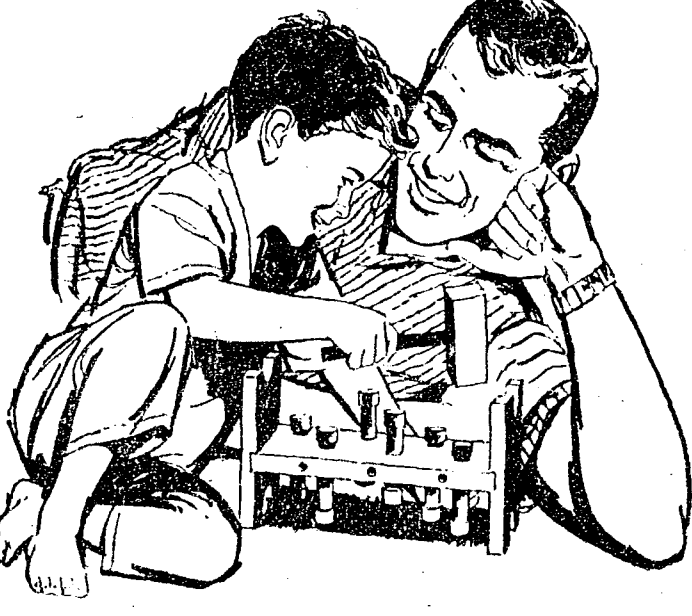
