

# Antonelli, McCovey May Go To AL in Inter-league Deal

NEW YORK (AP) — Southpaw Johnny Antonelli and first baseman Willie McCovey of the San Francisco Giants were rumored yesterday as almost certain to wear American League uniforms next year.

These are only two of the many name players who are expected to be bartered when the inter-league trade period, inaugurated last winter, is resumed next November.

Other established performers reportedly being readied for shipment to the other league include such former headliners as Duke Snider of Los Angeles, Robin Roberts of Philadelphia, Belly Pierce of the Chicago White Sox, Ryne Duren and Bob Turley of New York, Frank Lary and Frank Bowling of Detroit, Pedro Ramos of Washington and Tom Brewer of Boston.

Such ace sleuths as Eddie Stanky of the Cardinals, Mayo Smith

of the Yankees, Wid Matthews of the Braves, Bill Norman of the White Sox, Alex Campanis of the Dodgers and Hank Sauer of the Giants have brought back recommendations after spending weeks on the trail of clubs in the rival leagues.

## World Series May Open in Pittsburgh—If, If, If

NEW YORK (AP) — The World Series will open in the home park of the National League champions, presumably the Pittsburgh Pirates, Wednesday Oct. 5 and will shift to the American League city Saturday, Oct. 8 after two games and an open date.

Baseball Commissioner Ford Frick gave out the schedule yesterday after a meeting with representatives of six clubs, three from each league, and Warren Giles, president of the National League.

Baltimore, New York and Chicago of the American League and Pittsburgh, St. Louis and Milwaukee of the National League attended the meeting.
