

Shofar Announces Jewish New Year

Tonight the Shofar, or ram's horn, will be blown in synagogues throughout the world to proclaim Rosh Hashanah, the Jewish New Year of 5721.

Rosh Hashanah, celebrated on the first and second days of the Hebrew month Tishri, marks the beginning of the Ten Days of Penitence ending on the Day of Atonement, Yom Kippur.

During these ten days God remembers all his creatures and passes judgement on all persons.

According to traditional Jewish belief, the destinies of men are written down by God in the Book of Life on Rosh Hashanah. The names of the good are written down immediately; the names of the bad are blotted out from the Book.

The decisions of God regarding those who are neither good nor bad are reserved for the tenth day of the holiday, according to Jewish custom.

Thus Jews have ten days to examine themselves and to reach a reconciliation with God.

The New Year days are generally considered the most important and serious days of the Jewish religious year. The holidays are dedicated primarily to prayer and contemplation.

Special hymns and poems are recited in the synagogues to proclaim the holiness of the day.

Tonight, as on every eve of Rosh Hashanah, the Shofar will be sounded to summon the Jewish people to self-judgment, self-improvement, and atonement as they continue one of the most ancient religious customs.

The annual Horticulture Show will go on during Homecoming Saturday and Sunday in the Stock Pavilion.

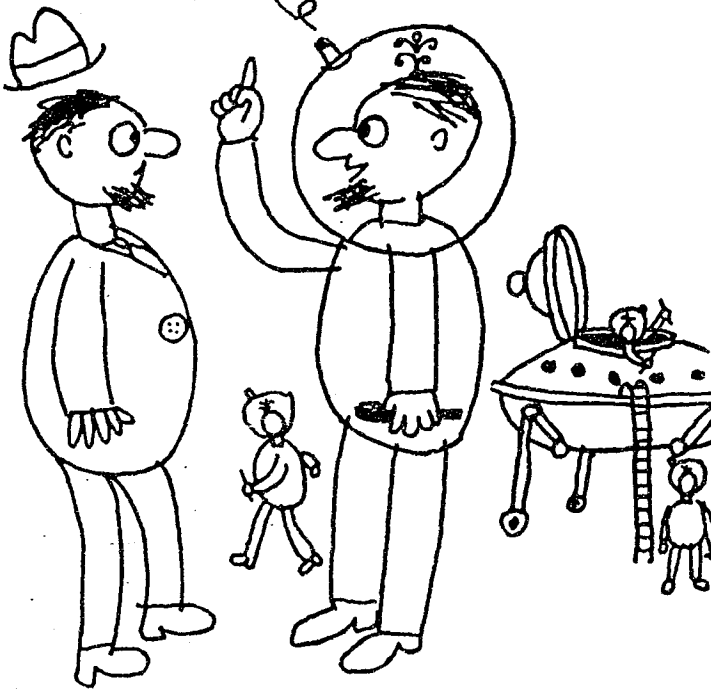
