

Econ Conference To Be Held Nov. 13

A conference on U.S. foreign economic policy will be held at the University Nov. 13-16.

Designed for business executives, labor leaders, government officials, journalists and other civic leaders, the 3-day program will include talks by many outstanding economists and public officials.

Included in the list of lecturers are Clarence B. Randall, special assistant to President Eisenhower and retired chairman of the board of Inland Steel Co., and Bert Seidman, economist of the research department of the AFL-CIO.

Other speakers will be Bruce Netschert, Resources for the Future, Inc.; S. D. Metzger, professor of law, Georgetown University Law Center; John E. Reynolds, Board of Governors, Federal Reserve System; Maurice Levy-Hawes, International Economic Consultants, Inc.; and Antonin Basch, the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development.

The conference is sponsored by the Center for Continuing Liberal Education, the College of Business Administration and the Alumni Association of the University. A grant from the Fund for Adult Education has aided in setting up the program.

In addition to lectures, the program will include discussion and question periods. Some of the subjects to be discussed are: U.S. policy toward development and utilization of world resources; problems of migration, population, growth and international wage differentials; foreign trade and aid; investments abroad; and U.S. economic policy in Latin America.

The conference is designed to contribute to more efficient and effective conduct of private business and of labor relations at home and abroad.

White Made Professor Of Speech

Dr. Eugene W. White, who has been on the University of Miami faculty, has been named associate professor of speech.

He is a native of Denver, Colo., and completed his undergraduate work at Oregon State College in general science. His master of arts degree in speech and his doctor of philosophy degree, also in speech, were conferred by Louisiana State University.

He taught at Louisiana State University before going to Western Reserve University in 1947 and he has been on the faculty of the University of Miami since 1949.

His research interests have been in the field of the historical development of rhetorical theory and history and criticism of American public address with emphasis on the Colonial period.

He is the author of two books, "Practical Speech Fundamentals," published in 1960 and "Practical Public Speaking," published in 1954. He is currently editor of "The Southern Speech Journal" and has published numerous articles in national journals in fields of speech and history.
