

High-Scoring Wing Leads Red Raiders

The Red Raiders of Colgate, bolstered by eight returning lettermen and an All-American wing, will try to make it two in a row over Penn State's booters tomorrow morning at 10 on Nittany Field.

Colgate upset the Lions, 4-1, last year on the way to a 7-1 season. Coach Mark Randall's team made it to the quarter-finals of the NCAA regional tournament, losing to Bridgeport, 3-2.

The Red Raiders have breezed through three games so far this year, shutting out RPI, 3-0, and Clarkson, 7-0, and downing Cornell, 4-1.

Jim Taylor, an All-American wing who scored 16 goals last year, heads a list of eight returning lettermen.

Taylor and forward Bob Lucas, who tallied 10 times last season, give Colgate a potent scoring attack.

Mack Edwards, a junior forward who was named to the all New York State team last year, and Ronald Glenn, a halfback who has scored three goals in three games this year, are other offensive threats.

Goalie Pete Smith heads the Red Raider defense. The Colgate net tender allowed only 13 goals last year and so far this season the only score against him came on a freak shot.

The Red Raider's victory last year was their first over Penn State in 18 meetings. That defeat left the Nittany booters with a midseason record of 1-3, and started them on the trail to the most disastrous year in Penn State soccer history.

When the dust lifted, the Lions' final log stood at 2-7, marking the first losing season in 15 years.

State coach Ken Hosterman isn't making any predictions about the outcome of tomorrow's game, but he knows that Colgate will be tough.

"Colgate's generally a big team," he said. "Judging from their soccer players, it seems you have to be at least six-foot tall to be admitted to the school."

Harriers Challenge Spartans

Michigan State, the perennial IC4A cross country powerhouse, will open its 1960 season tomorrow against Penn State's unbeaten Lions on the University golf course.

Spartan coach Fran Dittrich once again has a strong team; and he figures his boys will be a major contender for their sixth straight Big Ten crown.

In the past five years the Spartans have won five Big Ten championships, four straight IC4A titles, and two straight NCAA crowns.

Although the Spartans lost two of their top veterans, Fordy Kennedy and Bob Lake, they have plenty of lettermen back to provide the nucleus for this year's team.

The top returnee is senior captain Billy Reynolds, fourth place finisher in the 1959 NCAA meet.

Last year Reynolds was second in the Big Ten meet and sixth in the IC4A's.

Junior Jerry Young, who placed eleventh in the nationals, ninth in IC4A's, and fourth in the Big Ten meet, figures to be one of Dittrich's big guns this season.

Young and Reynolds, along with Kennedy, were named to the 1959 cross country All-American team.

Clayton Ward is another runner who should add punch to the lineup. Ward had a good record last season as a sophomore, placing sixth in the Big Ten and 25th in the nationals.

The only dark spot for Dittrich is Ed Graydon, who recently suffered a hernia injury and will be out for the season.

"The key to our success will depend upon the development of our sophomores," Dittrich said. The top newcomers to the var-

sity are Frank Weaver, Roger Humbarger and Karl Lady.

"Weaver is a very strong cross country runner with plenty of speed and if he develops as expected, he could press for the No. 1 spot," Dittrich said.

—Penn State found the Syracuse defenses rigid during the early years of the Orange-Lion rivalry. The Lions were shut out in seven of the first 15 games, and were never able to tally two touchdowns in one contest.

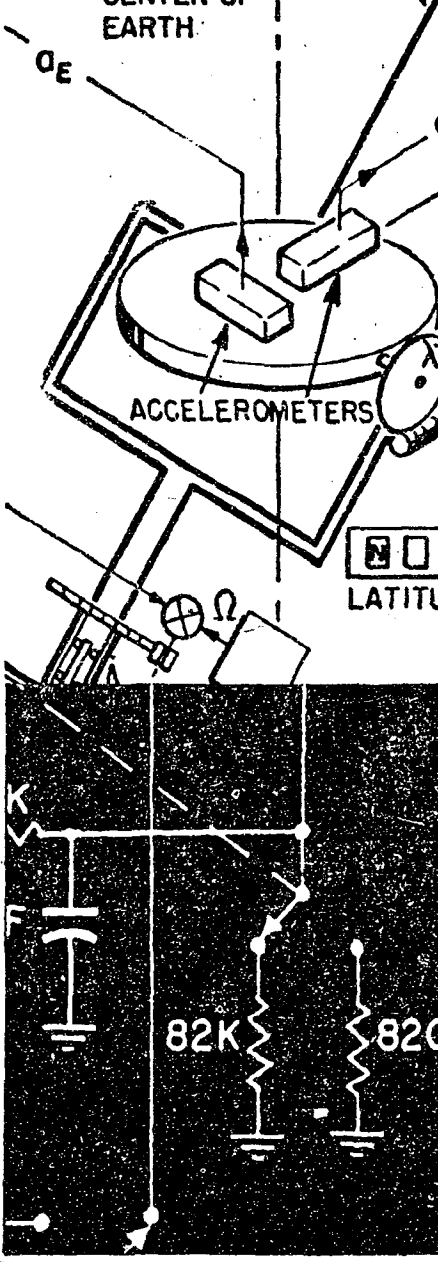
