

Upset-Minded WVA To Meet Harriers

The West Virginia cross country team, whipping along at a fast clip with six straight victories, will meet Penn State tomorrow on the University Golf Course, and the Mounties are talking nothing but "upset."

The Mountaineers have beaten Ohio University, Fairmount State, Waynesburg, Richmond, V.M.I., and Pittsburgh.

State, meanwhile, has compiled a 3-0 record, with its biggest win coming against Michigan State, the defending national champs.

Only Ohio U. and Pittsburgh have proven troublesome to the fast moving Mounties.

Ohio U's Ray Fleming completely outclassed the West Virginia runners, coming home 35 seconds ahead of the nearest Mountaineer.

But West Virginia swept the next five places to win, 26-30.

Pitt came even closer to eliminating the Mountaineers from the unbeaten ranks.

The Panther harriers extended West Virginia to the limit, but the Mounties finally won, 27-28. State scored a decisive 19-40 victory over Pitt.

Charlie Rea and Tom Spelsberg have been the big guns for the Mounties this season.

Rea has wracked up two first, a second and two thirds and he'll be counted on heavily when action begins tomorrow at 4:45.

Spelsberg started out poorly against Ohio University, placing fifth, but he has improved considerably in the past four meets, garnering a first and three seconds.

Raynor Baldwin and Herb Rogers have also been big contributors to coach Stan Romanouski's perfect record this year.

Baldwin's best performance of came against Fairmount State and Waynesburg, when he tied for

first with Spelsberg over the four mile course.

Baldwin has also captured three fourths and a sixth this season.

Rogers fell to seventh place against the Panthers, but in the four previous meets he took two thirds, a fourth and a fifth.

Rounding out coach Romanouski's squad are Larry Wycoff, Russ Collier, Glen Hunt, Bill Jenkins, Doug Kersey, Bob Van Enburgh, Dick Pomerengel, and Jim Young.

Braves Place Four on AP All-Star Team

NEW YORK (AP) — The Milwaukee Braves landed four players on the 1960 Associated Press major league all-star team named yesterday.

Third baseman Eddie Mathews, outfielder Hank Aaron, catcher Del Crandall and left-handed pitcher Warren Spahn were the Braves selected in the annual poll of baseball writers.

The American League champion New York Yankees were the only other club with more than one representative on the first team.

They placed first baseman Bill Skowron and outfielder Roger Maris. The lone member of the world champion Pittsburgh Pirates to be chosen was right-handed pitcher Vernon Law.

The remainder of the team included second baseman Pete Runnels of the Boston Red Sox, shortstop Ernie Banks of the Chicago Cubs and outfielder Willie Mays of the San Francisco Giants.

Spahn, who won 20 or more games for the 11th season, was a near-unanimous choice.

—Penn State will seek its fourth triumph over a Big Ten opponent when it faces Illinois Saturday. The Lions beat the Illini, 20-9, in Cleveland, Ohio, last year.
