

# Harriers, Booters Tackle Midshipmen

The Penn State cross country team, aiming for its first undefeated season since 1953, will clash with Navy in a dual meet on the University Golf Course tomorrow.

At the same time, Navy's unbeaten soccer squad will host Ken Hosterman's booters at Annapolis.

Coach Chick Werner's harriers will be shooting for their fifth straight win tomorrow. They have defeated Cornell, Pittsburgh, West Virginia and defending NCAA champs, Michigan State.

Navy has a 3-2 record with wins over Duke, Pittsburgh and Georgetown. The Middies lost to Maryland and Air Force.

Bernie Fleming, Bill Kiggins and Joel Heine have been the big point getters for Navy this year.

Fleming is the only member of the trio to score a first place in dual-meet competition. It came in the opener against Duke when Fleming flashed over the 3.7-mile course in 17:29.

Navy's strong point is overall depth. This was demonstrated against Pitt and Georgetown last Saturday when the Middies offset the first and second place finishes of Pitt's Harry Stokes and Georgetown's Fred Verdisoo

by sweeping third through eighth.

Navy's soccer team has been a little more successful than the Middie harriers.

Navy won its first four games this season, downing Haverford (2-1), Bucknell (4-1), Air Force (3-0) and Brockport State Teachers (4-1). The only blemish was a 1-1 tie with Penn last weekend.

Hosterman is looking forward to tomorrow's game. His booters looked impressive against Atlantic Coast Conference champ Maryland last week even though they lost, 4-1.

Navy Coach Glenn Warner said he was "pleasantly surprised" with this year's record. Warner was faced with a major rebuilding program at the start of the year because nine of his 11 starters had graduated.

Navy's biggest asset has been defense. So far the Middies have allowed only four goals in five games. "I didn't expect it to hold up nearly as well as it has," Warner said yesterday.

He termed the Navy offense "erratic and unsteady" in the first two games, and said that Navy was losing possession of the ball after one or two passes. But he said that the Middies outplayed Penn Saturday, taking 27 shots to the Red and Blue's 10.

# TKE Enters IM Grid Playoffs

Tau Kappa Epsilon played near flawless ball last night and went on to win its fourth straight IM game, 15-0, over Delta Chi. The win moved TKE into the playoffs. TKE entered the scoring column early in the first half with a safety.

TKE's first touchdown came after Gene Flick intercepted a pass on the Delta Chi 25. Quarterback Bob Rocky made the break pay off four plays later when he fired an aerial to Flick who scampered into the end zone. Mike Soccio converted for the extra point.

In the second half Soccio intercepted a Delta Chi pass and ran 20 yards for the touchdown. In other fraternity action, Chi Phi made the most of its scoring opportunities and downed Triangle, 14-0.

Phi Mu Delta trounced Pi Lambda, 26-0, and AEPi beat Delta Phi on first downs 1-0 to round

out the fraternity schedule.

In Independent play, Maple beat Hemlock on first downs; the Newman Club beat the Waring Chargers, 7-0; and the Tricks stopped the Blue Raiders, 12-0.

Fayette beat Beaver, 6-0, and Lycoming stopped York, 8-0, in the final game.

The first two are restored to full rights and privileges effective today after being on probation a year.

The four-year probationary period for North Carolina State will end on Nov. 13.
