The Senate Committee for Student Affairs "in view of finding that individual members of Lion's Paw have attempted to influence and manipulate student affairs" and "in view of the fact that it is difficult for a group to be dissociated from the acts of individual members," asked Lion's Paw to review its procedures and activities and report to the Senate Sub-committee on Organizational Control by Feb. 1, 1961. The report should include structure, member selection, time

and place of meetings, functions, activity publicity and the use of the name of the organization. After receiving the report the Sub-committee will make recommendations to the Student Affairs committee for possible action.

Members of Chimes, junior women's hat society, will be selling "all-day suckers" at tomorrow's football game.

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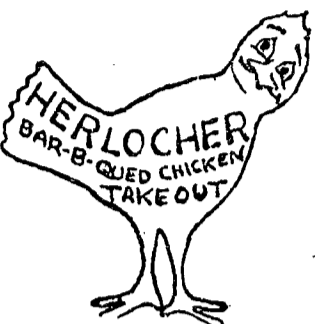
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
