(continued from page two) definitely ahead of the Russians," Chisman said. In discussing the Quemoy-Matsu issue, he said that it is "strictly a military matter." The problem involved is a question of military strategy, concerning the position of the two islands, Chisman said.

"Whether or not the islands should be defended is not the policy making decision of presidential candidates, Chisman said, "but rather the military decision of an area commander."

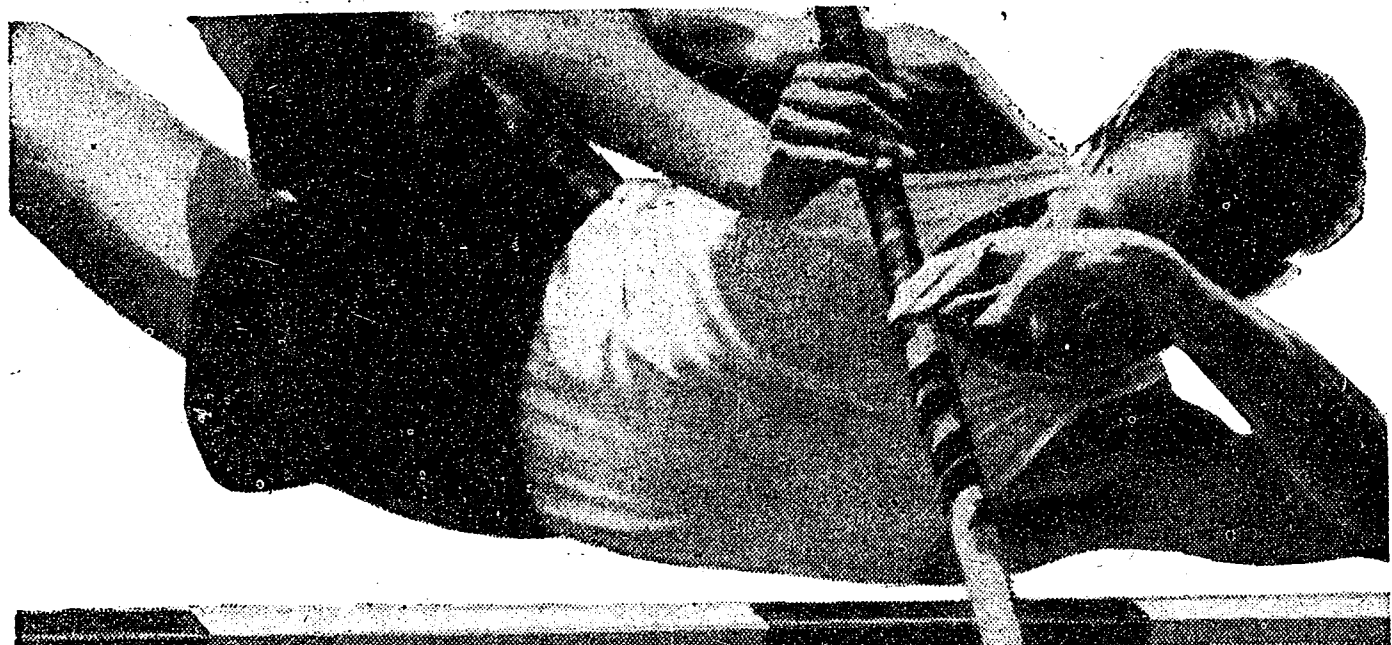
